# PRESIDENT'S REPORT 1970

The 1970 season was notable for the very eveness of all our age groups competing in the FPJFC competitions. This eveness was evidenced by the Club having the rare distinction of its five teams being competitors in the preliminary final of each grade. This was due to the U12s, U14s and U16s winning their first semi-final matches, all by convincing margins, and the U11s and U18s losing their second semi-final matches conversely by the narrowest of margins. Following their preliminary final matches the U11s, U14s, U14s and U18s moved to the grand finals, after hard fought contests. The U12s were eliminated, being comfortably downed by Morley. In the grand final matches the U11s lost their encounter by 3 points. The U14s came home strongly in the last quarter to annex premiership honours in their division. The U16s and U18s were comfortably defeated by CBHS. The premiership pennant distribution for 1970 was as follows: U11s and U12s (Morley), U14s (Coolbinia-Yokine), U16s and U18s (CBHS).

#### PRESIDENT'S SHIELD

The C/YJFC failed to win the President's Shield by the narrow margin of six points. The successful club for 1970 was the strong CBHS Junior Football Club. The Morley-Dianella JFC was a close third being a further six points behind the C/YJFC. Congratulations are in order to officials and players of the CBHS JFC for earning the award of champion club for 1970, and honour they also achieved in 1969.

#### ADDITIONAL TEAMS

The Club this year mounted an additional U11 team (the U11s Reserves). This team competed in the East-Swan competition. Our participation in this competition was due to the enthusiasm and energy of Mr. Barry O'Mahoney who organised and was partly responsible for the establishment of the East-Swan competition. In company with Mr. Keith Axford of Morley Police Boys, Barry deserves the highest credit for the outstanding success of this venture. We are desirous of continuing to field additional teams as our resources and workforce permit and to this end we would welcome approaches and offers of assistance for the 1971 season.

#### OUR PLAYERS

The C/YJFC continued to send to the East Perth Football Club, first class recruits in all the various league grades. I would specially congratulate ex Club champions, John Daniel and Paul Cook for their fine achievements in making the league team in their first year with the East Perth Football Club. Along with our other ex juniors now with the East Perth Football Club's minor grades, John and Paul have brought honour and distinction to us and we are sure that the immediate future years will see many more of our juniors making names for themselves in senior ranks.

At the other end of the scale I would also acknowledge the grand efforts of those players who tried and persevered throughout the season with the knowledge that they had no certainty of being regular team players. We witnessed throughout the season an enormous improvement in some of our players, due in the main to the additional effort these players put into training and pre-season preparations. Playing success for most players is proportional to the amount of dedication enforced and it is to these players who practised this discipline that I would specially commend.

#### CLUB ADMINISTRATION

The Club was once again extremely fortunate to have a full complement of officials with the added bonus that these officers were of the very highest calibre. Their willingness to undertake a variety of duties, not necessarily directly associated with their official position was appreciated by the Club's executive officers in particular.

To those propertymen, managers and committeemen, my sincerest thanks for the very fine work exhibited throughout the season. To the co-executive officers of the Club, Bill Forrest, our splendid secretary, Bob Stewart, our solid and reliable treasurer, Fred Holt and Ted Smith, vice presidents and workers extraordinaire, my sincerest appreciation for your very fine efforts throughout the year. To coaches Barry O'Mahoney, Ray Taylor, Mick Pooley, Bob Noble, Harold Jahn and Lance Stephenson, on behalf of all of us associated with the Club, our thanks and congratulations for your tremendous efforts and the time you made available throughout the season.

#### LADIES' AUXILIARY

The ladies of course, deserve a special mention for their fund raising and other efforts throughout the year and in this regard I would specially single out Mrs. A. Cantrell, Mrs. K. Morgan, Mrs. E. Fulcher, Mrs. V. Washbourne and Mrs. G. Stewart. The ladies are part and parcel of this organisation and I personally am very glad they are. Mrs. M. Forrest and Mrs. M. Crowe deserve a special mention for their raffle ticket selling efforts at Perth Oval along with Mrs. E. Fulcher.

#### DONATIONS AND ASSISTANCE

Assistance in cash and kind was appreciated by the Club's committee at various and frequent times throughout the season. I would especially thank Mr. Norm Mercer for providing an ample supply of cranges throughout the season for all teams in all our various grades.

The homes of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Allen and Mr. and Mrs. Harold Jahn were made available for players' teas in the latter part of the season. Gestures such as these promoted morale and team spirit and were thoroughly appreciated by players and officials of the U14s and U16s respectively.

#### JUNIOR COUNCIL AND KINDRED CLUBS

The help and comradeship from all the East Perth Junior Council Executive and Junior Club Delegates is gratefully acknowledged. In particular, I would single out Mr. Lisle Bremner (Junior Council Secretary) for his sterling efforts on this and other Club's behalf. In addition I would like to acknowledge the friendship, co-operation and help I personally received from officials of various junior clubs affiliated with the East Perth Junior Council.

#### FINANCE AND WALKATHON

Expenditure increased in 1970 due in the main to the purchase of four new sets of jumpers. Increased umpire fees and additional trophies were other contributing factors. To offset these increases the Club was obliged to supplement its traditional methods of raising revenue by conducting a Walkathon. The Walkathon was a great success and the proceeds enabled us to satisfactorily cover our financial commitments for 1970. The Club is very appreciative of the efforts of several young lasses. Some are sisters of our players and the others have no personal connection with the Club at all. These girls between them raised nearly \$100. Their names are as follows: Misses Shauna Forrest, Carol Smith, Beryl Smith, Terri Crowe, Megan Allen, Robin Gunn, Robin Martin, Jenny Crowe, Kerry Hobson, J. Gordon, Gaye Tolcan, D. Steffanoni, J. Miller and K. Slee. To these girls, our players, brothers, mums and dads - thanks very much for a job well done.

#### COOLBINIA OVAL

The Coolbinia Oval formerly known as Bradford Street Reserve is not expected to be available until late 1971. The Shire has approved the erection of facilities and have applied to the State Government for an allocation

of loan funds. If granted, it is expected that the construction of facilities would commence in the financial year 1971/72.

Building plans are in the course of preparation by the newly appointed Shire Architect who will incorporate in his design the proposed facilities specifically requested by this Club. They include kitchen, meeting and storage and other areas for which we will be required to contribute 25% of the cost.

I would sincerely like to acknowledge the assistance of Mr. Max White and Councillor Ron Stone for their help in the prosecution of our interests in the Oval.

#### CONCLUSION

The prospects before us are very exciting; the Club has a growth rate of about 20% per annum; new teams will probably be mounted in some grades by 1972 or perhaps in 1971 if the administrative support from parents is forthcoming.

In 1970 we will farewell several of our fine players and to these boys we say good luck and our best wishes and hope you achieve all your ambitions, whatever they may be.

In 1971 we will welcome many more juniors and we look forward with pleasure to their participation in our Football Club's playing fixtures and our social engagements.

## SECRETARY'S REPORT

The 1970 season completes a decade of competition football by the Coolbinia-Yokine Junior Football Club. In this report we have attempted to record the Club history in a condensed form, from the inauguration of the Club in 1960. The compilation of this information has needed considerable research. Former Secretaries of the Club in their wisdom retained a complete record of minutes and correspondence dating back to the first meeting which was convened in November 1960. The Club also retains every team book for each grade from 1961. In some cases we have relied on present and past officials to supply us with information. We trust there have been no major omissions. The 1969 report detailed the Club's Fairest and Best winners in all grades. We omitted the 1961 winners. This omission has been rectified in this year's report.

#### PHILIP RAKICH

Our research into players' statistics has revealed the following achievement by this player. Philip joined the Club in 1965 at the age of 10 years. He played his first game in the under 12 grade on April 24th 1965 against CBHS. Since this date he has not missed one Club game in which he was eligible to play. His game in this year's under 16 grand final against CBHS was his 107th consecutive appearance for the Club.

Congratulations Philip on an outstanding achievement.

#### REGISTRATIONS

The Club continues to grow in numbers. A total of 199 boys were registered for the 1970 season. This total includes 67 new registrations. A total of 38 boys who played in 1969 and were eligible to play this season, did not re-register.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank these two stalwarts for the valued assistance they have given me in the preparation and production of this report. Without their co-operation this project would never have got off the ground or into print.

## CONCLUSION

1970 has been a memorable year both on and off the playing field.

It has been a great experience for me being associated with such a fine group of young players and a conscientious group of officials who have all teamed together so well to maintain the traditions and aims of the Coolbinia-Yokine Junior Football Club.

# FOUNDATION AND HISTORY 1960-1970

#### FOUNDATION

The foundation of the Club initiated from a meeting which was convened by Mr. Neville Reynolds who at the time was President of the East Perth Junior Football Council. The meeting was held at the Coolbinia Primary School on November 24th, 1960. A number of interested parents attended and it was decided to call an inaugural meeting on December 15th, 1960 under the chairmanship of Mr. Reynolds with Mr. J. Harvey acting as Secretary. There was a large attendance of boys and parents at this meeting and the following parents were elected as Office Bearers for the 1961 season:

President

Messrs. R. B. Daniel, A. Meaton, A. Naismith and A. Barras

There were several suggestions regarding the naming of the Club. These included: The Scaddan J. F. C. and The Alexander Park J. F. C. It was finally decided that Coolbinia-Yokine would be the most fitting as the original intention in creating the Club was to cater for the youth of both districts.

#### HISTORY 1961-62

The Club was accepted into the East Perth Junior Football Council in early 1961 and teams were entered in the Under 14 and 16 grades. The captain of the Under 14 grade was Chris Davies and the Under 16 grade captain was Brian Daniel. The nucleus of the two teams was drawn from the Alexander Park Football Club for juniors which for a number of years had been conducted by Mr. Laurie Bandy. The teams competing in the EPJF Council under 14 and 16 grades in 1961 comprised of: Inglewood-Bedford Park, East Perth, C. B. C. Perth, Highgate, Morley Park, C. B. H. S. and Maylands.

Our 1961 under 14 grade team coached by Mr. Norm Ashton won the premiership in their first year of competition defeating the Maylands team who were coached by Mr. Lisle Bremner who was later to become the hard working and esteemed Junior Council Secretary. The first annual Club report issued on March 20th, 1962 reporting on the success of the under 14 grade team stated: "The premiership win was a great team effort and a well deserved win. To the Maylands team under Mr. Lisle Bremner we offer our condolances on their loss and our congratulations for a very fine game."

1961 was also the first year in which a Club representative was selected in a W. A. School Boys Football Team. The player being Paul Hardie.

The financial position of the Club at the completion of the 1961 season showed a balance in the bank of £23. 4.11.

1962 saw a change of Secretaries. Mr. Max White resigned and his position was taken over by Mr. Bob Hardie the father of Paul and Tom. This was a year of consolidation for the Club. Neither of our teams finished in the final four. Paul Hardie was selected again as a State Schoolboy Footballer - this time as captain.

# 1963

Mr. Bruce Daniel took over the position of President from Mr. Les Barnes. During the 1961 and 1962 seasons the Club was known as the Coolbinia-Yokine Under 14 and Under 16 Football Club. In 1963 a decision was made to form an under 18 team. Players from the Northern Districts Temperance Club merged with the C/Y JFC to form this team and the name of the Club was changed to The Coolbinia-Yokine Junior Football

Club. Mr. Max White took over the position of Secretary. The under 16 team was defeated in the grand final by Bedford. The under 14 district combined team won the W. A. N. F. L. championship and Geoffrey Daniel won the gold medal presented to the Fairest and Best player in the grand final of this championship.

At Junior Council level, Mr. Lisle Bromner was appointed Secretary. Even in these early years our Club records of correspondence and Junior Council minutes disclose the start of the great influence he has had on junior football, due to his persistent efforts, perfectionist ideals and industrious character.

# 1964

The under 12 grade competition was inaugurated and the Club team played off in the grand final and were defeated by Inglewood. The under 14 grade team coached by Mr. John Gallagher won the premiership by defeating Mt. Lawley. The captain of the under 14 team, Ross Hogan scored another first for the Club by winning the E.P. J. F. C. District Fairest and Best Award for that grade. Paul Cook was runner-up in the E.P. J. F. C. District Fairest and Best Award for the under 12 grade. Geoffrey Daniel and Bill Forster were selected as players in the State Schoolboys Team. This year also saw the first Coolbinia boy to reach league status when Gary Hassett moved up to East Perth.

To finish off a most successful season the East Perrh District combined under 16 team won the W. A. N. F. L. championship. Club members of the team included Peter Daniel, Frank Clune, Robert Duirs and Michael Levin.

#### 1965

At the end of the 1965 season the under 18 grade team went on tour to Melbourne. The manager of the team was Mr. Norm May, assistant managers were Mr. Neville Reynolds and Mr. Bob Noble. Several matches were played in Melbourne. Records disclose that in a match against the Footscray Technical School a trophy awarded to the Fairest and Best player, was won by Russell Argent. Club records testify to the tremendous contribution in time and effort by the Secretary, Mr. Max White in his endeavours to make this trip a success.

The under 14 grade team captained by John Daniel and coached by Mr. John Gallagher won the grand final, for the second successive year, by defeating East Perth - Highgate. Geoffrey Daniel won the E.P. J. F. C. award for the District Fairest and Best player in the under 16 grade.

#### 1966

The start of the 1966 season saw a change in Secretaries. Mr. Les James took over from Mr. Max White. All grade teams qualified for the final rounds.

The under 18 grade team were defeated in the preliminary final by CBHS 8-10 to 6-5.

The under 14 grade team were defeated in the first semi-final by Morley 7-3 to 6-3.

Our under 12 grade team won the first semi-final defeating CBHS 6-3 to 3-3. In the preliminary final Meltham 4-11 defeated Coolbinia 5-4. Coach Bob Noble considers this team to be one of the best combinations he has coached.

Supporters and officials will long remember the under 16 grade team of 1966, and many say this was the best team the Club has produced and perhaps the unluckiest. The team which was coached by Mr. Bob Boucher was undefeated in qualifying rounds. In the second semi-final Coolbinia 9-7 defeated Inglewood 3-3. The grand final was played against CBHS, in cold, wet and blustery conditions. At the final siren scores were equal. The game was then decided by a further two quarters of ten minutes each. CBHS had first use of the

breeze and went on to win a low scoring game by the narrowest of margins. Unfortunately the actual scores were never recorded in the teams book. The team members were: G. Barnes, L. Bartas, R. Beaton, W. Boucher, J. Bougher, M. Border, T. Cockram, J. Daniel, C. Dundas, W. Fulcher, R. Garcia, K. Hills, R. Hogan, I. James, K. McCarthy, J. McLeod, R. Noble, K. Tolley, B. Tomich, K. Vann.

Barry Hersey was selected in the State Schoolboys Team.

Bill Boucher won the E. P. J. F. C. Award for the District Fairest and Best player in the under 16 grade.

#### 1967

After completing a period of four years as President of the Club, Mr. Bruce Daniel retired and Mr. Bill Crowe took over this position.

Two of the Club's greatest footballers namely John Daniel and Paul Cook were selected in the State Schoolboys Team. John gained a further honour in being selected in the All Australian Schoolboy Team.

Ken Tolley had the distinction of being the first junior player to complete 100 games for the Club. Ken commenced his career in 1962, at the age of 11 years, in the under 14 grade and played 46 games over a period of three years in this grade.

Geoffrey Daniel completed an outstanding and successful junior football career by winning the E. P. J. F. C. District Fairest and Best Award for the under 18 grade.

The Club registered its first success in the competition for the President's Shield when they drew with CBHS.

#### 1968

This year will be long remembered by officials, supporters and players as our most successful year since our entry into the East Perth Junior Football Council competitions.

At the end of the qualifying games, Club teams in all grades had qualified for the finals.

The Club won the President's Shield outright for the first time.

The under 12 grade team were undefeated in the qualifying games and suffered their first defeat in the second semi-final when they were defeated by CBHS 4-0 to 2-7. In the grand final the team who were coached by Mr. Bob Noble comfortably defeated CBHS 7-4 to 0-3.

In the under 14 grade grand final our team coached by Mr. Neville Power led for three quarters and were finally defeated by Morley 9-2 to 7-2. Peter Trott was awarded the trophy for the Fairest and Best player in this match.

The under 16 grade team, coached by Mr. Lance Stephenson were defeated in the preliminary final by Inglewood 7-6 to 3-3.

Our greatest triumph for the season was in the under 18 grade competition. In the second semi-final we were soundly beaten by Inglewood 12-10 to 7-5. The preliminary final was won by Coolbinia from E.P. Highgate 9-9 to 6-7.

The grand final was played at Hillcrest Oval - the captain of the team Ian James played his 100th game in this match. The coach of the team was Mr. Brian Pascoe. On the day we were only able to field eighteen U/18 grade players, the two reserves were U/16 grade players namely Rodger Smith and Ross James. After the sound defeat by Inglewood in the second semi-final, it was generally thought that the grand final would be a repetition of this match. Much to everyone's surprise, Coolbinia led by a narrow margin at three-quarter

time and Inglewood had the use of the breeze in the last quarter. At three-quarter time interval, the coach delivered a very inspiring speech calling on the players to give of their very best in the last quarter. The rest is history - Coolbinia through excellent teamwork and sheer determination went on to record our fist premiership success in the under 18 grade defeating Inglewood 8-4 to 6-5. Mr. Brian Pascoe the coach deserves the greatest praise for the manner in which he handled the team throughout the season.

Paul Cook gained selection for the second successive year in the State Schoolboys Team. He was selected as captain and won the award for the Fairest and Best player in the Carnival. At the completion of the Carnival he was chosen as captain of the All Australian Schoolboys Team.

Graeme Radford achieved another first for the Club when he won the award for the E.P. J.F.C. District Fairest and Best in the under 12 grade.

The Daniel family had another success added to their long list of Junior Football achievement, when son John won the award for the E. P. J. F. C. District Fairest and Best in the under 18 grade.

1968 saw the introduction of an under 11 grade team from the Club. The team played in the East-West competition with moderate success.

#### 1969

Mr. Les James retired from the position of Secretary and Mr. Bill Forrest took over his position. During his three years as Secretary, Les performed his duties in a most workmanlike manner and his forethought and wisdom in collating a set of Club records from the inauguration of the Club in 1960 has been invaluable in maintaining a record of players and officials who have been associated with the Club.

The E.P. Junior Football Council introduced an under 11 grade competition and if for no other reason 1969 will be remembered for the outstanding success this competition achieved in its first season. 72 boys were registered from the Club in this grade.

For the first time since 1964 our players failed to win a District Fairest and Best Award.

The under 11 and 18 grade teams were defeated in the preliminary finals and the under 12 and 14 grades lost their first semi-final matches. The under 16 grade team finished sixth.

1969 saw the end of the "Daniel Era". The excellent work done by father, Bruce was matched on the playing field by his four sons, Brian, Peter, Geoffrey and John. Between them the boys played 321 games for the Club and in doing so won three E.P. J. F. C. District Fairest and Best Awards and nine Club Fairest and Best Awards. A distinction unparalleled in the history of the Club and junior football.
