SECRETARY'S REPORT, 1973.

I have now completed two years as Secretary of the Coolbinia-Yokine Junior Football Club and most rewarding years they have been. It has often been stated that one has to be in a position such as this for at least two years as the first year is spent in learning the job and then this knowledge can be used in the second and subsequent years. This has certainly been the position in my case. It has been a great pleasure to work with such efficient and dedicated Office Bearers and Committee Members.

For a Club to run as efficiently as the Coolbinia-Yokine does, demands a team of efficient and industrious fathers, who must be prepared to give up a great deal of their leisure to assist the Club. I have made mention in circulars of fathers who volunteer their services to the Club. Each weekend, during the football season we have fielded six teams and this in itself requires many Officials. Unfortunately, during this season, some fathers have had two jobs to do. When one considers the number of fathers represented in our Club, we feel that this is wrong. I am asking any father, who reads this and is not actively engaged in the Club, to come forward and volunteer his services.

During this season, we have been able to use our own ground for home matches for the first time. This has helped to consolidate the Club. At first we were dubious as to whether the surface of the Oval would stand up to the wear and tear. For this reason our No. 2 Oval, Alexander and Coolbinia School Oval were used for training purposes. It is to be hoped that with correct manuring and watering the surface will become first class. An innovation has been the selling of drinks and morning teas during our home games. The Club is greatly indebted to Mrs. Woodley and her band of helpers who have worked hard to provide these amenities.

1973 SEASON

At the beginning of this season the ages were altered, being changed to Under 11, 13, 15 and 17. Our Club met with mixed success during the season. Three teams finished in the final four. The Under 17 team was beaten in the first semi-final while the Under 13a and 13b made the final but were defeated. Congratulations to these teams! On the credit side some 125 boys had a game of football each weekend and thoroughly enjoyed themselves. At present indications are that we will also field six teams next year.

TROPHY WINNERS

I wish to congratulate boys who won trophies during the season. To those boys who have completed their football with this Club, I am asking for your assistance. There are several positions which you could fill to help your club. This year, two ex-players volunteered their services as a result of a circular sent to all past players and did an excellent job. During the season, I saw all the games played by the Under 11 and 15 teams and I was most impressed by the way the boys conducted themselves on the field.

In conclusion, I wish to thank Mr. Dave Cargill, the Club Registrar, who has the difficult and exacting task of registering all players, keeping the necessary statistics and compiling most of the material in this report and secondly, Mr. Ron Jones and his Social Committee, who have had the arduous task of arranging and conducting all our social functions. 





The boys were very well behaved and a pleasure to coach with participation in a team sport generally assisting their character build, which at this age is the real purpose of playing.







Ken Travers proved, as usual, a handful at training, however this year he had a good mate in Gary Veitch who nearly got the better of me; their determination is terrific.



The 1973 Season has been one of ups and downs for us. We played 14 games won 8 lost 5 and 1 drawn to finish in 4th place in a ten team competition.


Our win in the first Semi-Final was the result of extremely good team football. We were beaten the next Saturday in the Final by a much stronger and faster team on the day.


The 1973 Season has not been a successful Season for winning matches due mainly to a shortage of players and lack of application by a few of the more senior players both at training and during the matches.

Although the team finished 4th, the boys proved they could hold their own with the top sides, and lack of height was a major factor in the team's loss to East Perth in the first semi-final.


