SECRETARY'S REPORT 1981

Well the Action of our 21st. year of Junior Football has just about finished and although we have not won any premierships this year it has been a really great year.

This year we started off with the "Back to Coolie" Night - or should I say weekend. On Friday night we had a Disco in our enormous tent right on the oval which was a great night. The kids talked about it for a month or more. Then that Great Saturday Night - "Back to Coolie". With all the fun of a Gala Ball and the enjoyment of being held in a circus tent the night was a fabulous success even though the numbers were not what we hoped for. The attendance of Neville Reynolds who started the concept of Coolbinia-Yokine Junior Football Club and the inaugural Coach Dr. R. Aitkin and eleven of the first team was definitely all that was hoped of the night and I think all who attended will vouch what a great night it was.

Pre-season training started off with approximately twenty boys, although the squad looked bigger as the Colts side trained with us.

The influx of young players was very pleasing as far as the future development is concerned, and our club should grow in strength as the years roll on.

The start of the season showed we were still light on numbers with the 11's, 15's and 17's Grades but in all cases players from a lower grade filled in until after some heavy recruiting and all teams had the required number of players.

It has been pleasing each training night when I go down to the oval and see our 9's Grade training. Paul has these kids really going good and is giving them a thorough grounding on which to base their junior football. Going by the noise alone, these kids are enjoying their football to their utmost.

The 11's this year have not had a good year being a very short on numbers, but the boys have worked hard under their Coach and we believe that next year most of them stay in that grade again and will be the big strong team of that competition.

The 13's have had a fairly good year but have been plagued by injury. From a squad of twenty-six their Coach was hampered by key players unable to play because of injury but apart from this all the boys have trained well and are shaping up to be top class little footballers. Things look real good for the future if these boys all stay together.

The 15's have had a most unfortunate year with a full team for the first game and losing one of the top players in that first match with a broken collarbone. Then the following week another player given a four weeks rest by the P. & D. Board. All efforts of their Coach to lift the spirits of the boys seem to have little effect and numbers dropped off at training with the boys only turning up for matches. We hope the boys of this squad put in a bigger effort next season for they have all the skills.

The 17's this year have shown patches of brilliance but unfortunately not often enough. The boys have trained very well but lack the height and strength of some of the teams and some of the scores against them have really demoralized them. Next year will be the second year in 17's Grade for most of the boys and we feel next year with a bit more maturity, height and strength and the thorough grounding they have gained this year they will be a force to be reasoned with.

My thanks to all the Coaches and team managers for all the help and assistance that they have given me this year.

My thanks to our Social Organiser for carrying on even though the response to our functions were far below the desired numbers. I am sure Geoff became increasingly more frustrated as he tried every trick in the book to increase the response to our social activities. Thanks Geoff for your fine effort.

A very big thank you goes to our President, Mr. Bill Canning for his assistance and encouragement he has given me throughout the year. Bill has advised that he will not be nominating for President this coming year and this saddens me for in working with Bill I know that his thoughts have always been for the welfare of the boys of the Coolbinia-Yokine Junior Football Club. Thanks a million Bill.

To our Treasurer, I thank her for keeping our books in shape and for the presentation of the monthly Balance Sheet so we could all see how we were situated. I also thank her for the hours she spends trying to read my scrawl as she types all my letters, minutes and notes. Thanks Eileen.

COOLBINIA-YOKINE JUNIOR FOOTBALL CLUB

FOUNDATION AND HISTORY 1960-1970

FOUNDATION

The foundation of the Club initiated from a meeting which was convened by Mr. Neville Reynolds who at the time was President of the East Perth Junior Football Council. The meeting was held at the Coolbinia Primary School on November 24th, 1960. A number of interested parents attended and it was decided to all an inaugural meeting on December 15th, 1960 under the chairmanship of Mr. Reynolds with Mr. J. Harvey acting as Secretary. There was a large attendance of boys and parents at this meeting and the following parents were elected as Office for the 1961 season:

President	Mr. Les Barnes
Vice Presidents	Mr. S. Griffiths and Mr. L. McCarthy
Sec./Treasurer	Mr. M. White
Committee	Messrs. R.B. Daniel, A. Meaton, A. Naismith and A. Barras

There was several suggestions regarding the naming of the Club. These included : The Scaddan J.F.C. and The Alexander Park J.F.C. It was finally decided that Coolbinia-Yokine would be the most fitting as the original intention in creating the Club was to cater for the youth of both districts.

HISTORY 1961-62

The Club was accepted into the East Perth Junior Football Council in early 1961 and teams were entered in the Under 14 and 16 grades. The captain of the Under 14 grade was Chris Davies and the Under 16 grade captain was Brian Daniel. The nucleus of the two teams was drawn from the Alexander Park Football Club for juniors which for a number of years had been conducted by Mr. Laurie Bandy. The teams competing in the EPJF Council under 14 and 16 grades in 1961 comprised of : Inglewood-Bedford Park, East Perth, C.B.C. Perth, Highgate, Morley Park, C.B.H.S. and Maylands.

Our 1961 under 14 grade team coached by Mr. Norm Ashton won the premiership in their first year of competition defeating the Maylands team who were coached by Mr. Lisle Bremner who was later to become the hard working and esteemed Junior Council Secretary. The first annual Club report issued on March 20th, 1962 reporting on the success of the under 14 grade team state : "The premiership win was a great team effort and a well deserved win. To the Maylands team under Mr. Lisle Bremner we offer our condolences on their loss and our congratulations for a very fine game."

1961 was also the first year in which a Club representative was selected in a W.A. School Boys Football Team. The player being Paul Hardie.

The financial position of the Club at the completion of the 1961 season showed a balance in the bank of 23.4.11.

1962 saw a change of Secretaries. Mr. Max White resigned and his position was taken over by Mr. Bob Hardie the father of Paul and Tom. This was a year of consolidation for the Club. Neither of our teams finished in the final four. Paul Hardie was selected again as a State Schoolboy footballer - this time as captain.

1963

Mr. Bruce Daniel took over the position of President from Mr. Les Barnes. During the 1961 and 1962 seasons the Club was known as the Coolbinia-Yokine Under 14 and 16 Football Club. In 1963 a decision was made to form an under 18 team. Players from the Northern Districts Temperance Club merged with the C/Y JFC to this name of the Club was changed to The Coolbinia-Yokine Junior Football Club. Mr. Max White took over the position of Secretary. The under 16 team was defeated in the grand final by Bedford. The under 14 district combined team won the W.A.N.F.L. championship and Geoffrey Daniel won the gold medal presented to the Fairest and Best player in the grand final of the championship.

At Junior Council level, Mr. Lisle Bremner was appointed Secretary. Even in these early years our Club records of correspondence and Junior Council minutes disclose the start of the great influence he has had on junior football, due to his persistent efforts, perfectionist ideals and industrious character.

1964

The under 12 grade competition was inaugurated and the Club team played off in the grand final and were defeated by Inglewood. The under 14 grade team coached by Mr. John Gallagher won the premiership by defeating Mt. Lawley. The captain of the under 14 team, Ross Hogan scored another first for the Club by winning the E.P.J.F.C. District Fairest and Best Award for that grade. Paul Cook was runner-up in the E.P.J.F.C. District Fairest and Best Award for the under 12 grade. Geoffrey Daniel and Bill Forster were selected as players in the State Schoolboys Team. This year also saw the first Coolbinia boy to reach league status when Gary Hassett moved up to East Perth.

To finish off a most successful season the East Perth District combined under 16 team won the W.A.N.F.L. championship. Club members of the team included Peter Daniel, Frank Clune, Robert Duirs and Michael Levin.

1965

At the end of the 1965 season the under 18 grade team went on tour to Melbourne. The manager of the team was Mr. Norm May, Assistant Managers were Mr. Neville Reynolds and Mr. Bob Noble. Several matches were played in Melbourne. Records disclose that in a match against the Footscray Technical School a trophy awarded to the Fairest and Best player, was won by Russell Argent. Club records testify to the tremendous contribution in time and effort by the Secretary, Mr. Max White in his endeavours to make this trip a success.

The under 14 grade team captained by John Daniel and coached by Mr. John Gallagher won the grand final, for the second successive year, by defeating East Perth - Highgate. Geoffrey Daniel won the E.P.J.F.C. award for the District Fairest and Best player in the under 16 grade.

1966

The start of the 1966 season saw a change in Secretaries. Mr. Les James took over from Mr. Max White.

All grade teams qualified for the final rounds.

The under 18 grade team were defeated in the preliminary by CBHS 8-10 to 6-5.

The under 14 grade team were defeated in the first semifinal by Morley 7-3 to 6-3.

Our under 12 grade team won the first semi-final defeating CBHS 6-3 to 3-3. In the preliminary final Meltham 4-11 defeated Coolbinia 5-4. Coach Bob Noble considers this team to be one of the best combinations he has coached.

Supporters and officials will long remember the under 16 grade team of 1966, and many say this was the best team the Club has produced and perhaps the unluckiest. The team which was coached by Mr. Bob Boucher was undefeated in qualifying rounds. In the second semi-final Coolbinia 9-7 defeated Inglewood 3-3. The grand final was played against CBHS, in cold, wet and blustery conditions. At the final siren scores were equal. The game was then decided by a further two quarters of ten minutes each. CBHS had first use of the breeze and went on to win a low scoring game by the narrowest of margins. Unfortunately the actual scores were never recorded in the teams book. The team members were : G. Barnes, I. Barras, R. Beaton, W. Boucher, J. Bougher, M. Border, T. Cockram, J. Daniel, C. Dundas, W. Fulcher, R. Garcia, K. Hills, R. Hogan, I. James, K. McCarthy, J. McLeod, R. Noble, K. Tolley, B. Tomich, K. Vann.

Barry Hersey was selected in the State Schoolboys Team.

Bill Boucher won the E.P.J.F.C. Award for the District Fairest and Best player in the under 16 grade.

1967

After completing a period of four years as President of the Club, Mr. Bruce Daniel retired and Mr. Bill Crowe took over this position.

Two of the Club's greatest footballers namely John Daniel and Paul Cook were selected in the State Schoolboys Team. John gained a further honour in being selected in the All Australian Schoolboy Team.

Ken Tolley had the distinction of being the first junior player to complete 100 games for the Club. Ken commenced his career in 1962, at

the age of 11 years, in the under 14 grade and played 46 games over a period of three years in this grade.

Geoffrey Daniel completed an outstanding and successful junior football career by winning the E.P.J.F.C. District Fairest and Best Award for the under 18 grade.

The Club registered its first success in the competition for the President's Shield when they drew with CBHS.

1968

This year will be long remembered by officials, supporters and players as our most successful year since our entry into the East Perth Junior Football Council competition.

At the end of the qualifying games, Club teams in all grades had qualified for the finals.

The Club won the President's Shield outright for the first time.

The under 12 grade team were undefeated in the qualifying games and suffered their first defeat in the second semi-final when they were defeated by CBHS 4-0 to 2-7. In the grand final the team who were coached by Mr. Bob Noble comfortably defeated CBHS 7-4 to 0-3.

In the under 14 grade final our team coached by Mr. Neville Power led for three quarters and were finally defeated by Morley 9-2 to 7-2. Peter Trott was awarded the trophy for the Fairest and Best Player in this match.

The under 16 grade team, coached by Mr. Lance Stephenson were defeated in the preliminary final by Inglewood 7-6 to 3-3.

Our greatest triumph for the season was in the under 18 grade competition. In the second semi-final we were soundly beaten by Inglewood 12-10 to 7-5. The preliminary final was won by Coolbinia from E.P. Highgate 9-9 to 6-7.

The grand final was played at Hillcrest Oval - the Captain of the team Ian James played his 100th game in the match. The coach of the team was Mr. Brian Pasco. On the day we were only able to field eighteen U/18 grade players, the two reserves were U/16 grade players namely Rodger Smith and Ross James. After the sound defeat by Inglewood in the second semi-final, it was generally thought that the grand final would be a repetition of this match. Much to everyone's surprise, Coolbinia led by a narrow margin at three-quarter time and Inglewood had the use of the breeze in the last quarter. At three-quarter time interval, the coach delivered a very inspiring calling on the players to give of their very best in the last quarter. The rest is history - Coolbinia through excellent teamwork and sheer determination went on to record our first premiership success in the under 18 grade defeating Inglewood 8-4 to 6-5. Mr. Brian Pascoe the coach deserves the greatest praise for the manner in which he handled the team throughout the season.

Paul Cook gained selection for the second successive year in the State Schoolboys Team. He was selected as captain and won the award for the Fairest and Best player in the Carnival. At the completion of the Carnival he was chosen as captain of the All Australian Schoolboys Team.

Graeme Radford achieved another first for the Club when he won the award for the E.P.J.F.C. District Fairest and Best in the under 12 grade.

The Daniel family had another success added to their long list of Junior Football achievement, when son John won the award for the E.P.J.F.C. District Fairest and Best in the under 18 grade.

1968 saw the introduction of an under 11 grade team from the Club. The team played to the East-West competition with moderate success.

1969

Mr. Les James retired from the position of Secretary and Mr. Bill Forrest took over his position. During his three years as Secretary, Les performed his duties in a most workmanlike manner and his forethought and wisdom in collating a set of Club records from the inauguration of the Club in 1960 has been invaluable in maintaining a record of players and officials who have been associated with the Club.

The E.P. Junior Football Council introduced an under 11 grade competition and if for no other reason 1969 will be remembered for the outstanding success this competition achieved in its first season. 72 boys were registered from the Club in this grade.

For the first time since 1964 our players failed to win a District Fairest and Best Award.

The under 11 and 18 grade teams were defeated in the preliminary finals and the under 12 and 14 grades lost their semi-final matches. The under 16 grade team finished sixth.

1969 saw the end of the "Daniel Era". The excellent work done by father, Bruce was matched on the playing field by his four sons, Brian, Peter, Geoffrey and John. Between them the boys played 321 games for the Club and in doing so won three E.P.J.F.C. District Fairest and Best Awards and nine Club Fairest and Best Awards. A distinction unparalleled in the history of the Club and junior football.

1970

This year we started another team - U/11's B Team who played in the East-Swan Competition and in fact we were fielding six teams in all. Although our five teams playing in the E.P.J.F.C. competition, played in the preliminary finals only our U/14 brought home a flag by defeating C.B.H.S. 3-7 to 3-4 - a close match.

This year we also saw the start of the senior football careers of John Daniel and Paul Cook who both made league in their first year with East Perth.

1971

The 1971 season has seen our overall playing performances decline as compared to the 1970 season. This was expected as we suffered a severe setback due to the league boundary redistribution exercise. The loss of area, previously available to us, affected the strength of most teams fielded by the Club.

However despite the redistribution the C.Y.J.F.C. teams overall performed very creditably. We had 5 out of our 6 teams in their semi-final matches. Their playing performances in being narrowly beaten were full of merit. Only the U/12 made it into the Grand Final against Dianella. Dianella proved slightly stronger to win the Grand Final by 5 points.

This year saw our first social cabaret which turned out to be an outstanding success.

Tony Morgan made the State School Boys team which won the Australian Carnival in Launceston.

1972

Mr. Bill Crowe retired from his position as President and this was taken over by Mr. Max White and also Mr. Bill Forrest retired as Secretary and his position was taken over by Mr. Tony Withers.

The big step this year was we moved into our new Clubrooms at Bradford Street Reserve. We fielded six teams again this year. Three of the teams made the finals but this was as far as we could go.

1973

At the beginning of this year the age group was altered and this upset the balanced of some of the teams to the extent we only met with mixed success during the season. During this season we were able to use our own ground for home matches for the first time. This has helped to consolidate the Club. This year we opened our Canteen and sold drinks and morning teas at our home matches. This year was the end of an era where Mr. Max White was connected with the Club ever since its conception in 1960.

1974

This year we experienced a decline in junior players as we were only able to field four teams compared with six in 1973. Our total registration this year was only 112 this year due to the boundary redistribution at the end of 1970, ageing of our area and inroads of other junior activities.

Notwithstanding our decline in playing members, as a Club we had a successful year. Two of our teams made the finals. Ric Withers not only made the State School Boys team but was elected Captain.

1975

This year sees us making a come back. Three of our five teams made the finals and out of those the U/14 and U/18 made the Grand Finals. The U/14 lost to Bayswater who had not been beaten throughout the season and the U/18 won and brought home our first premiership flag for a few years. Socially we had a great year with two Cabarets being held and both being a complete sell out.

This year was our first Kick-a-thon and Fathers and Sons match.

1976

This year again we started off with a lack of numbers and had to have a major recruiting drive ending up with a high percentage of first year players. This makes life difficult for our Coaches and through all grades we only achieved moderate success.

At least our players polled well in the E.P.J.F. Voting with two players coming within one vote of winning the District Fairest and Best.

1977

This year we have improved as U/12 made it as far as the Preliminary Final and the U/14 and U/16 made it to the Grand Final. Unfortunately no team was lucky enough to win the flag but all showed good for the following season.

Our Club this year sent a team to Elizabeth Park in South Australia and a very successful trip it turned out to be.

Jon Curtis made Club History to be the first person to win the Presidents Trophy twice.

John Mottram was selected to the State School Boys team.

1978

Two boys from Coolbinia-Yokine won the E.P.J.C. District Fairest and Best. They were Jamie Daniels in U/14 and Geoff Withers in U/16. Over the past few years these two boys have excelled on the field, winning many awards. This in turn continues to uphold the great name of our Club.

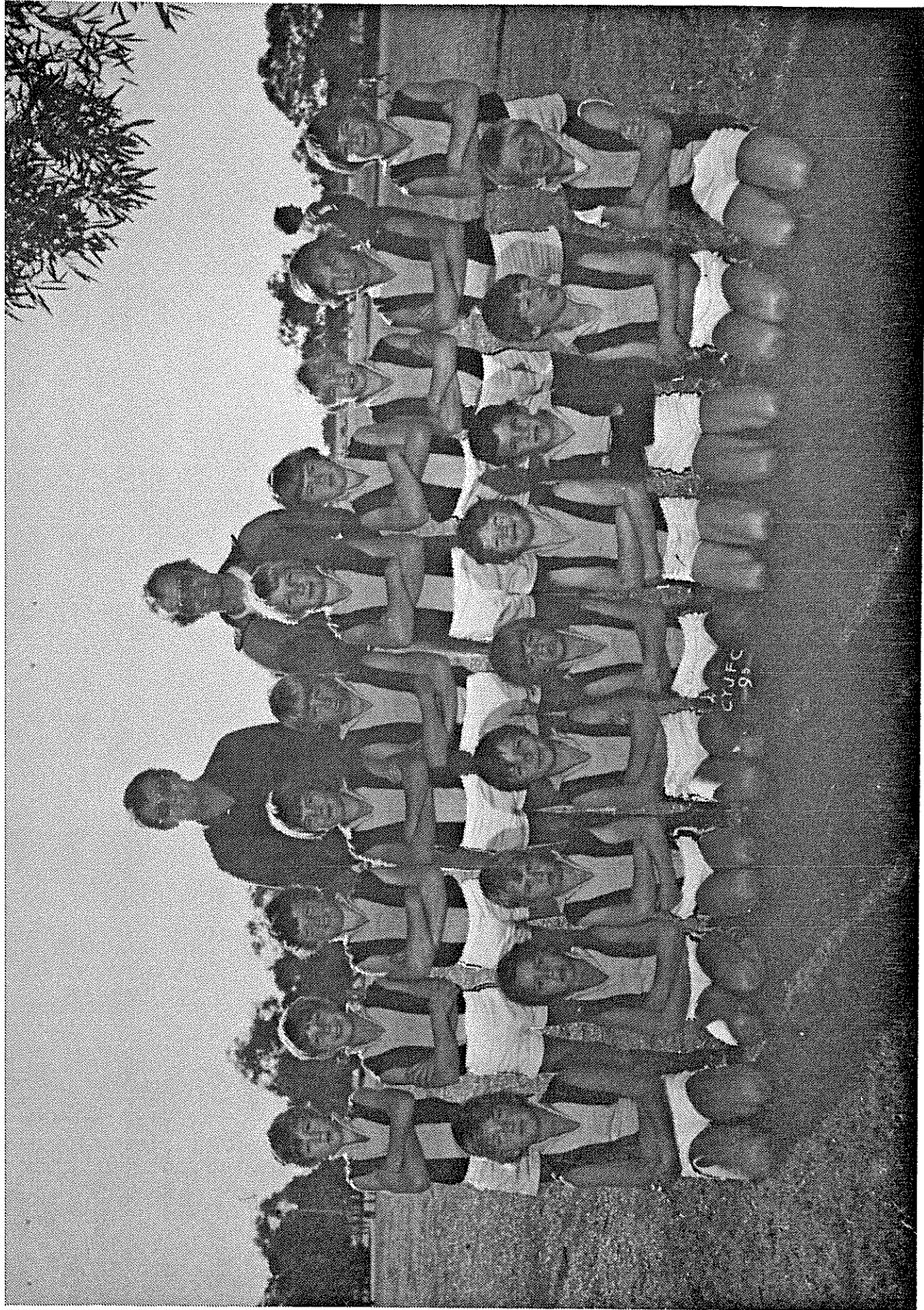
We had a very young side this season and many of the boys are still eligible for the 9's next year. This augers well for a great 1982 season for the 9's.

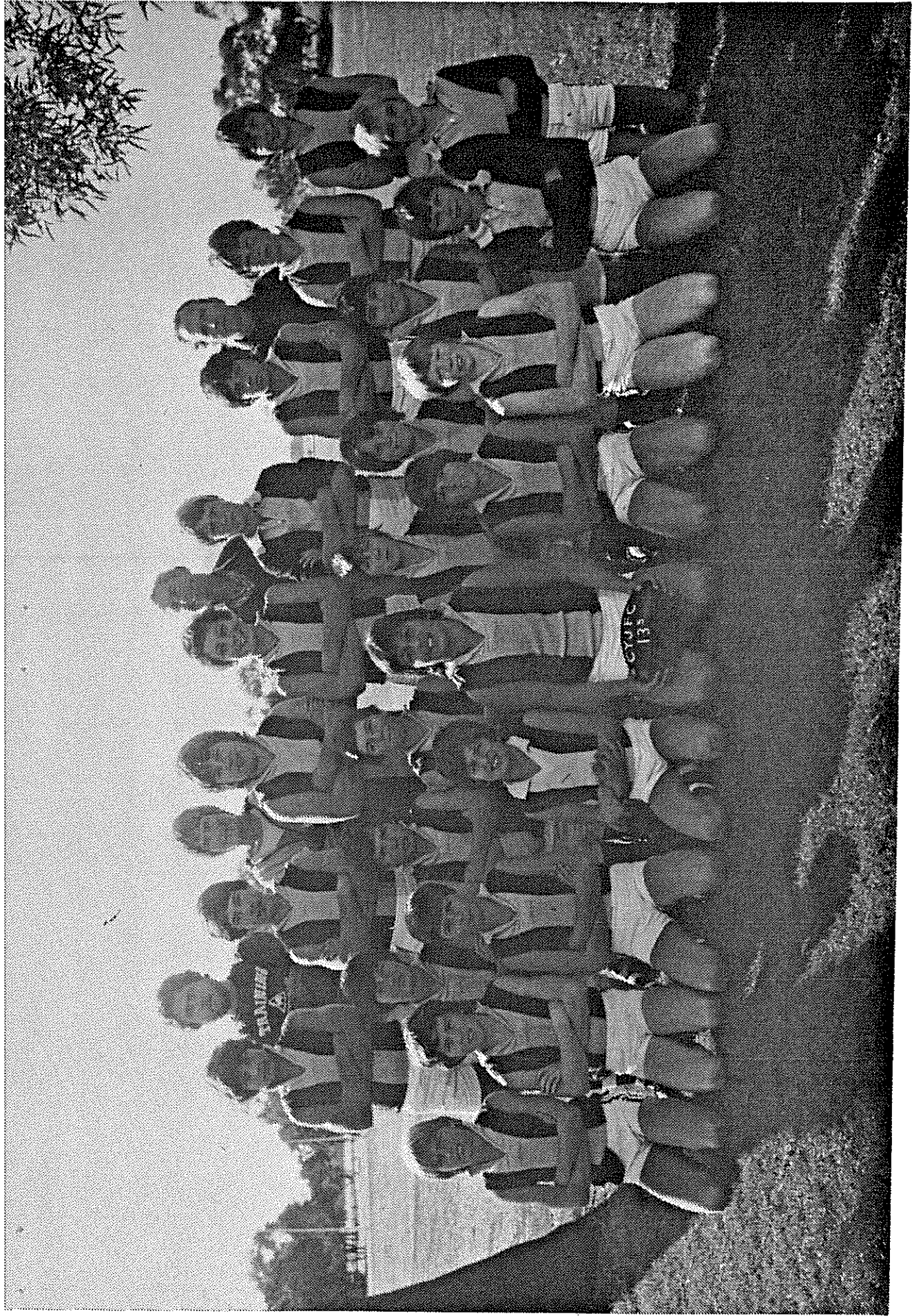

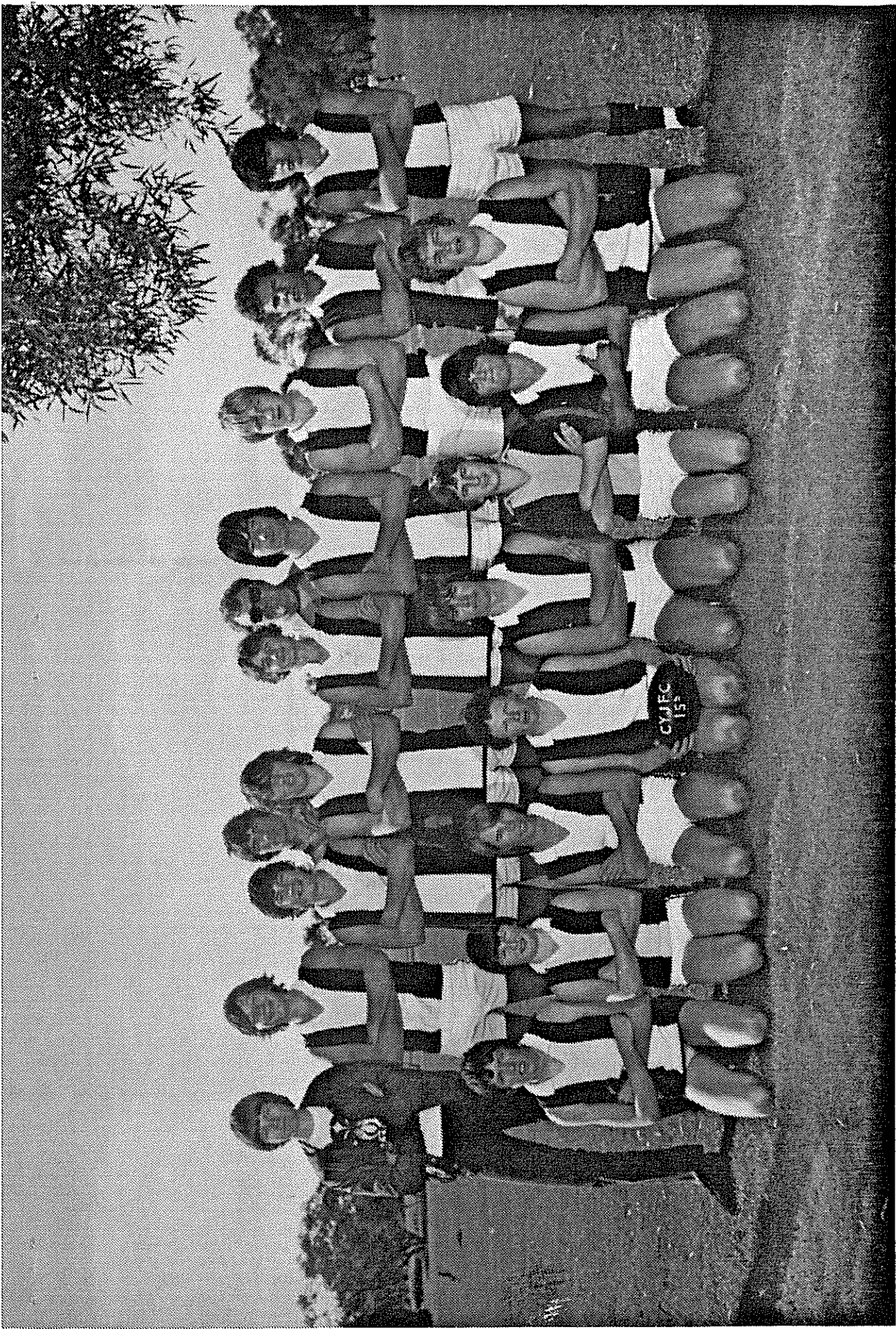

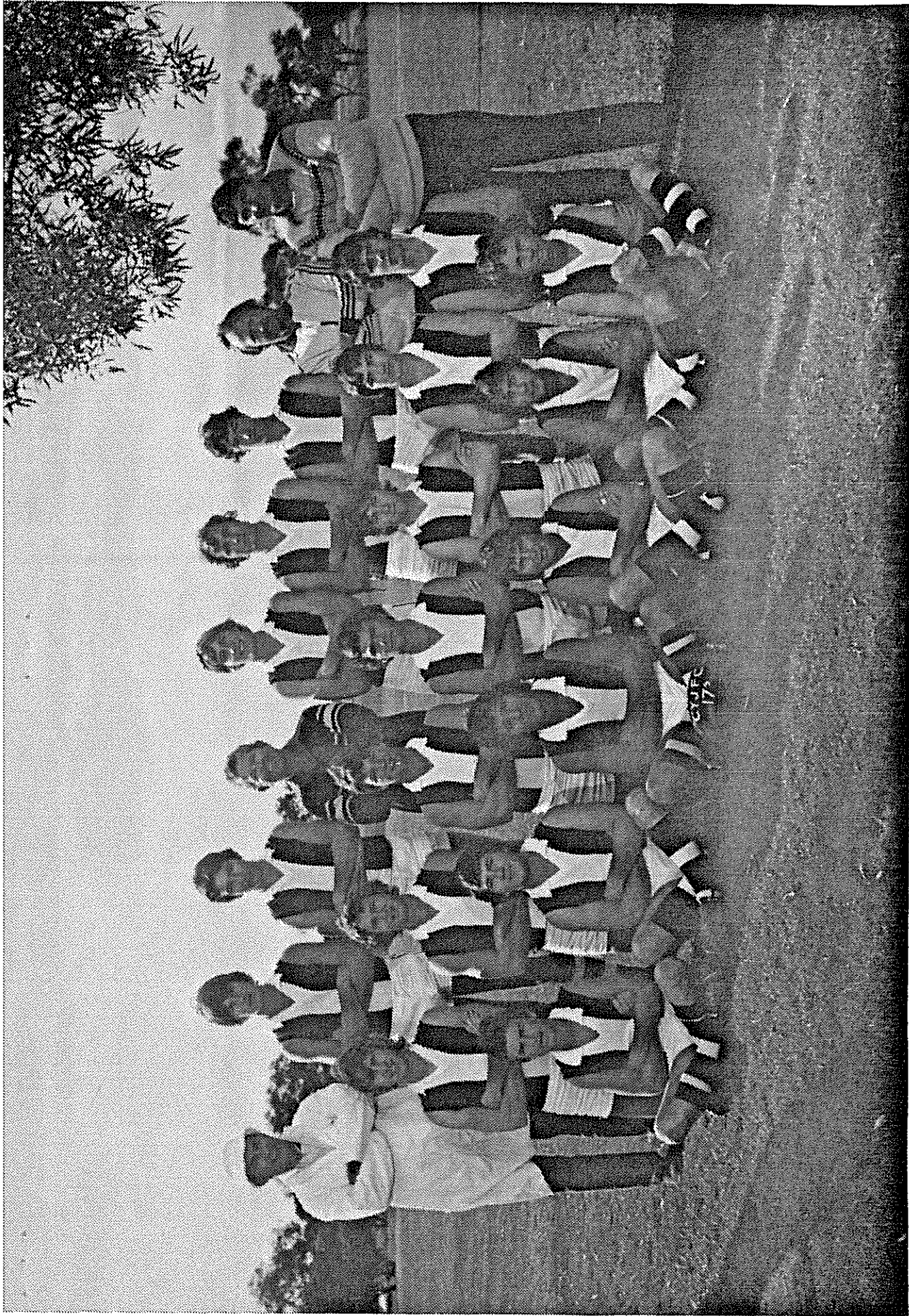
