## PRESIDENTS REPORT 1982

Dear Members and Players,

My role as President since opting to take the position midway through the first round has been a mixed bag and not without the odd hassle, the first of which was unhappy parents of players who were missing out on games where younger players were being upgraded into higher age groups. Thankfully it was finally resolved with a motion that no boys would be upgraded for any reason at the expense of boys in that age team. All appears well in that area and will not happen again.

Rapport in the Executive and Committee had been somewhat strained in the early part and it was obvious to me that achievement of personal milestones and extension of duties had been at the expense of willing helpers and players to become involved and play their real individual roles as committee men, players or supporters.

It saddens me to hear six or so of the boys from 15's say they are going to play for Dianella Panthers next year. Reasons vary from "too strict", "boring" and "we never win". Much more must be done within the club to make the juniors stay, the main point of which is to make the "after football" situation either after training or matches more social. By creating this situation I believe the players, parents and the club will grow to what it was and what it should be. Full marks to Mr. Geoff Pitman for his endeavour last year in this area.

An important portfolio lacking this year was that of Social Secretary and whilst this work load was shared with reasonable social successes resulting, I'm sure if a single member played this role, greater success would have been achieved. The Beef and Burgandy was a wonderful night although slightly lacking in numbers. The Cheese and Wine night failed only in so much that it was not patronized and those that attended had a great night and I would like to see it on the agenda next year. Thanks to raffles conducted with prizes left over on the night, a small profit resulted.

Our Annual Cabaret was not of the calibre of past years and whilst Alexander Park Tennis Club is not the greatest venue, the night was a reasonable success and would have been even better if the 50 or so folk who said they would attend had done so. Next year I would like to see the show on the road again, but with it fully catered for in a bigger hall. Our games night was a great success and would have to be a must next year or even before the season starts.

Dee Robinson, our Miss Football did an excellent job, particularly towards the end and without any real outside help other than her sister, Joanne as her Committee. Congratulations Dee.

I would like to see this project shelved next year whilst we get our "own house" in order, and secondly and mainly that for the life of me I can't see the reason for working for 50 cents in the dollar. Congratulations also to those who participated in the raffle day at East Perth.

Football wise, no great successes, although the 9's nearly made it and from what I saw of the finals they were pretty unlucky, especially having to play the top team first and wish several players short. I thought they had their second game won but this was not to be. Bad luck to the boys - good work Coach Trevor and Manager Peter.

Paul Ringrose did well with the 11's and brought home the flag in the plate. I hope we see Paul and all his boys next year. The 13's lost the final of the plate but were not disgraced. Coach Alan Bishop acknowledged his inability to coach next year due to work commitments and in his final address spoke keenly to his boys. I hope they follow on with his well put points. Thanks Alan and good luck in the future. Thanks also to Manager Owen Wintle.

15's were up and down and Coach Tony did well to win a few games with the boys. 15's seem to be more unsettled than other age groups. Endeavour was lacking in some areas although I have noted a remarkable improvement in most of the boys and I am sure there will be even greater improvement as they grow into young men ready for next years age group.

I do think 15's football starts too early as a lot of the boys seemed to have late nights on the Saturday and were not really 100% fit at the start of play. Thanks also go to Manager David Owens.

At the beginning of the season I would have backed the 17's for the final. Things went wrong somewhere, maybe when their skipper was missing as a result of injury; or ruckman Graham was hurt (maybe Timmy Morgan should have spent less time on the ground prostrate) I'm not sure, but I guess Coach Ivan is not sure what went wrong. Most games I saw were top class junior football and well done to the boys and coach Ivan. Most of these boys pass out of junior football this year and moves are afoot to re-establish a Colts Team. I sincerely hope this comes to fruition for the boys sake and also for the sake of the Club as I'm sure the Club is coming to a crossroad of some affiliation with the Amateurs. Recognition of the amateurs is important if we are to build the Club into what it should be. Thanks also to Manager Val Pereira.

Earlier in the year I wrote to the Stirling City Shire applying for an extra ground light. This has finally been approved and Mr. Gordon Shearwood from the Shire assures me it will be erected in February, 1983, in the eastern side of the oval. Our contribution to this project is \$1,000.00 of which the amateurs have promised to donate \$500.00. Permission has also been granted by the Shire to extend our Clubrooms. Although Shire will not contribute by way of a gratuity, they have indicated assistance in other areas. Dependent on who is elected to the board, the rate at which this proposal goes ahead lies on the boards interest. If I have the opportunity to participate I will start plans for fund raising the day after elections. Estimated costs are between \$20,000 and \$30,000 and I believe this can be achieved.

Goal and Boundary umpires have been a problem in some grades and I hope that next year an effort is made to establish guaranteed help in this

area. At some matches it has been frustrating for Managers to fill these positions and whilst it is their job, they can be let down. I believe Managers should have more rights than they have been given traditionally and would advocate that next year they are given this. If their team needs requisites to function correctly then it should be the Managers prerogative to secure these items from club funds. There should be no question when it comes to the provision of necessaries such as first aid, quarter time refreshments, decent footballs etc. and that the Manager acquires same.

A must for the Club next year is a personal address system and procurement of this is being investigated. Another must is that all outside complaints only be acted on by the board if that complaint is in writing.

In concluding I must thank all the Ladies who helped with washing jumpers, running canteen and other social and fundraising activities. Thanks to time keepers such as Doug McGregor, groundsman like Mick Curtis, coach helpers such as Don Kerr and Keith London. Dee Robinson, our Miss Football accelerated her efforts and also assisted outside her requirements as an Entrant.

Thanks to Secretary Val and Treasurer Eileen, my 1st. and 2nd. Vice Presidents is Tom O'Farrell and Carol Robertson; Registrar, Peter Robertson and immediate past President is Bill Canning for his role as Delegate to the East Perth Junior Council.

I trust we will see you all next year as I feel it will be a good one.

## SECRETARY REPORT 1982

It is with a feeling of sadness that I sit down to write this Report as I realise that it is the last I will write for the Coolbinia-Yokine Junior Football Club Annual Report.

As I look back over the year I see degrees of frustration in the form of insufficient players for some of our teams in some of their matches and passages of joy in glorious wins on the field which lifts a team ten feet high and proud to pay for Coolbinia-Yokine.

Pre-season started off with approximately twenty boys and most of these in the junior sides.

The influx of young players was very pleasing to see as far as the future development is concerned, and our Club should grow in strength as the years roll on. All Parents should try to boost our numbers by letting friends and neighbours know where "the best football club" for their children to play football is situated.

The start of the season still saw us light in numbers in the 15's and 11's but players from the lower grades filled while some heavy recruiting found players and we ended up with good numbers in all teams.

The Nines Grade have really shown the way to all our teams this year. Their attendance at training has been great and Trevor Clarey and Peter Quinn have given all the boys a thorough grounding on which to base their junior football. The boys have only lost 3 or 4 matches this year and it is good to see some good young footballers coming up. To bear all this out this year's winner of The Presidents Trophy comes from the Nines Grade. Congratulations to all these boys - you have done very well.

The Elevens Grade. What a greatly improved team this year. The boys have come from just a mediocre side to improve and fight their way into the final of the bottom four. This is a great effort for most of the boys are in their first year in this Grade. Next season we may have a champion team here. NOTE: Pleased to report the boys came from behind to take off the Plate Premiership. Congratulations boys.

Our Thirteen Grade boys had an up and down sort of season. We thought that these boys would really show the way for Coolbinia this season but this was not to be as they are a small side and lacked the physical size and strength of their opponents throughout the year. Playing in the Preliminary Final of the Plate Competition however, they come from behind to fight their way into the final which shows they have got it if they decide that they are going to put it together.

Our problem side throughout the year would have to be our 15's Grade. This side nearly did not get off the ground at the start of the season through lack of players. Credit must go to the Coach who undertook some heavy recruiting and managed to get sufficient players to play and have a reserve. The attitude of the boys was not good and this was very evident at training where numbers were often down as low as three or

four boys, but the sadness was more evident by the lack of parental support. With the exception of two or three dads there was no support or assistance to the Coach whatsoever and this did not help the Coach, who is new to the Club, to mould his charges into a better team with some fighting spirit.

I would like to thank those boys who did try; who did attend training, and I hope to see you back next year. Finally I would like to thank the 16 boys who played in the Preliminary Final of the plate. You tried your best and certainly were not disgraced - and I think we would have won if we had had a full team.

The Seventeens Grade, although slow to get moving certainly came out of the woodwork and we ended up with a training squad of 29 boys with often 24 at a training session. These boys had all the skills to take the flag but lack of determination robbed them of their chances in the final four. However, they defeated Dianella in the second semi of the Plate Competition to go straight into the final and the determination was showing in that match. NOTE: Once again I am pleased to report that 17's team have taken off the Plate Premiership. Congratulations boys.

My thanks go to all Coaches and Team Managers for the effort you have put in during the year. For those of you who are new to our Club we are very pleased to have you aboard and hope you will be here next year. A big thanks must go to you all in the manner you have controlled your players during the year and I am pleased to report that Coolbinia-Yokine did not have any player before the Protests and Disputes Board this year. This must be a reflection on the quality of our Coaches. Thanks guys.

Thanks to John Wright who took over as President during the year. I know what it is to step in part way through the year and I hope I have been of assistance in your settling in.

To our Treasurer, once again I thank her for keeping our books in shape and for the presentation of the monthly balance so we could all see how we are situated. I also thank her for doing all my typing and being my general assistant. Thanks Eileen.

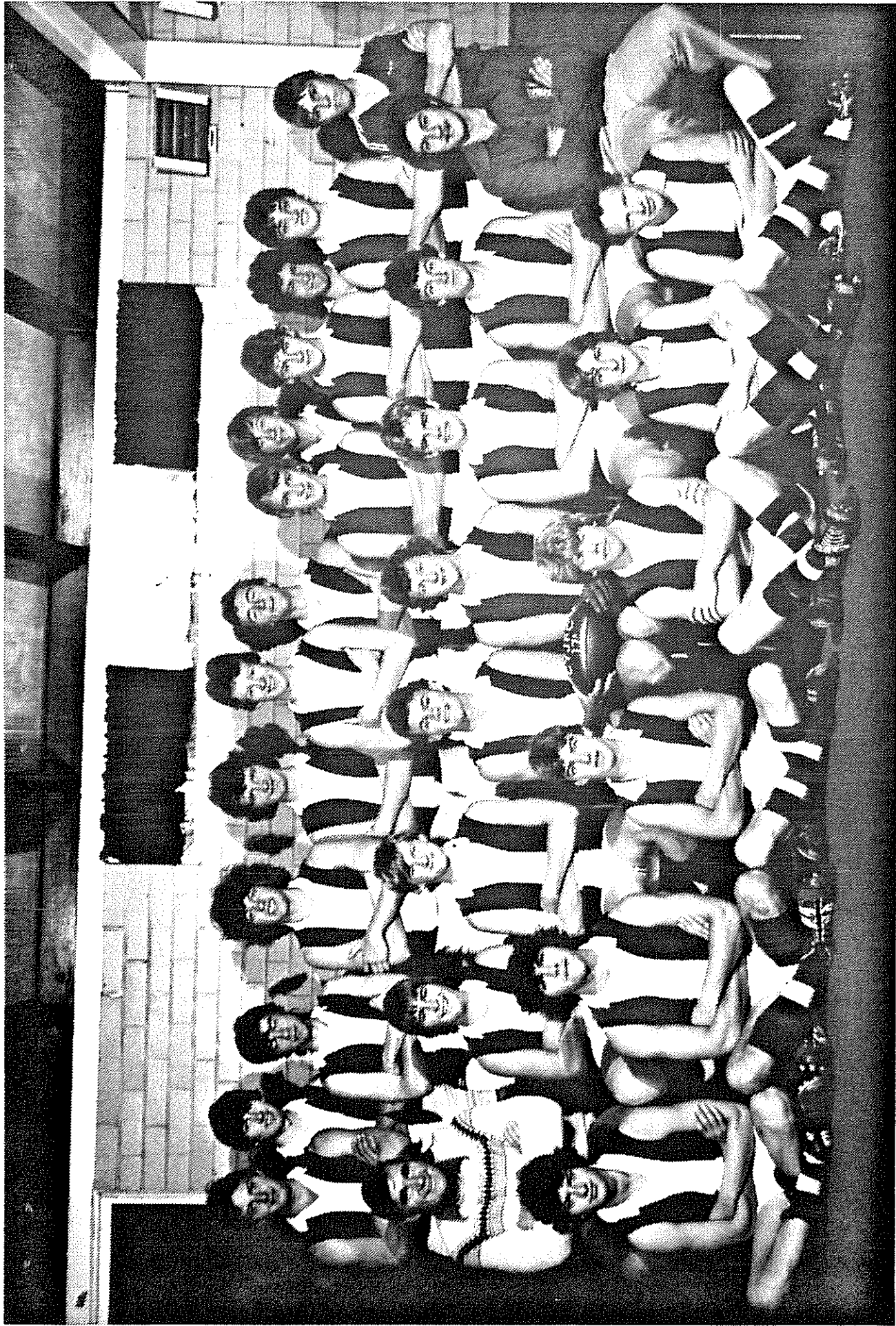
