

PRESIDENTS REPORT 1992 Charles Musca

This is my third year as President of the Bombers.

The Central Districts Junior Football Association had our club in their top 6 out of 24 for participation, organization, on field behaviour and performance. Unfortunately, the Best Club Award in the association is difficult to win unless you have numerous teams in the top 4. You also need to win finals, so considering we had only one team in the finals and only two teams playing "Standard Rules" it is pleasing that we have such a high rating.

Our pre-season effort concentrated on increasing numbers in all grades, in particular our Freeball (for under 8's) and the u/17's. With only 10 players available to play Under 17's, I tried for 6 weeks to establish a team right to 3 days before the first game. Unfortunately, I wasn't able to gain any more than two players, which resulted in most players going to other clubs. On the bonus side however, we gained a lot of Freeballers, which augurs well for our Club. Freeball went off brilliantly this year led once again by Chris Peck ably assisted by his manager, Dolph Danti. The boys participated in several carnivals wearing the Red and Black Guernseys for the first time since our inception. These 5, 6 and 7 year olds looked great running onto the field for their first game.

The 9's had a big year developing skills and winning many hard fought games, thoroughly enjoying their season under first year coach Errol Couch. Alistair Ewell was another new coach to the Bombers this year who did a stirling job with the 10's giving them great training skills and clear direction in games.

Our ll's got better and better as the season progressed with Tony Catania and his team being rewarded with a scintillating and polished display in the ll's Carnival.

Claremont helped us recruit our Under 14's coach in Darian Cheffers, a reserve player for Claremont, who made this season a huge learning year for his team with many advanced training skills and methods of play. Basil Merendino followed his boys up to the u/15's producing a big finals chance with the team playing so well winning most of their games. Unfortunately they played one of their worst games of the season in the finals and got eliminated. Our club must do a lot of hard work next year in order to field a strong u/17's team. I would encourage the u/15's to start talking to a few older boys they know and get them down to the club next year.

A big congratulations to Selami Dauti and Mason Davy for winning the Fairest and Best and Runner Up in the Association. (Under 15's)

The Committee was a well tuned group this year mainly due to the experience and knowledge of the people involved. Lee was absolutely irreplaceable in her role as Secretary. Her husband Vice-President, Graham Davy, supported me loyally and diligently. Peter Tweedy (our Treasurer) doubled up as Bombers Bulletin Editor which resulted in a very interesting and precise Bulletin. Well done Peter, you made a huge contribution this year.

Max, once again, was busy registering new players. Max must love his involvement and we hope he stays on indefinately. A special thanks to Tony Catania who headed our fundraising efforts this year. He was such a big help that he has been duly rewarded with the "Outstanding Achievement Award" for season 1992. To all other helpers "THANKS"!!!

The Parent participation improved significantly this year with most grades having people come forward to assist.
