



The total of 228 active registered players represents an increase of almost 12% on our 1997 strength. A strong increase in numbers in the 9s required the formation of two teams in that grade, and an additional team was also fielded in the 11s. Numbers were down in Auskick, where the club was a victim of its own success, as many players were found to have made such good progress that they were promoted to the 9s!

New registrations for the year totalled 83 over all grades, compared to 71 for 1997.

This year we were fortunate to be able to attract quite a few players from other clubs which were unable to field teams in some grades due to lack of numbers.



ADRIAN LONGWOOD is one of the new players we had this year and always likes to run and bounce the ball. Expect a big future from this young boy.



AARON IOZZI is a very versatile team player. With very good hand passing and shepherding skills, he is always eager to assist his team mates.


DAMIEN HARVEY continues to develop and has worked very hard all season. A determined player and possesses a very good passing kick. Damian has shown some excellent skills over the season.


