


PRESIDENT'S

Towards the end of last year I had the honour of being elected President of The Bombers Junior Football Club. I have to admit it was not a position that I actively sought. In fact I took on the job somewhat reluctantly, purely because there were no other takers and I did not want to see the club go leaderless into the 2001 season.

Now, with the season coming to a close, I can look back and say that it has been for the most part an enjoyable and rewarding experience; it has also been hard work at times! I would like to thank all our sponsors for their support and all players and parents who took part in the Chocolate Drive.

Player numbers in the modified rules grades (9s-12s) were generally good, we were able to field at least one team in every grade. Numbers in Auskick (6-8s) were a little disappointing and this is an area the club will have to pay more at-

tention to in the future – these are the Bombers players in the making. The Standard Rules (13s-17s) is an area of major concern, not only for our club but also throughout the Central Districts area. The dropout rate between 12s and 13s is alarming and matters do not improve in the older grades. The Association and its member clubs are currently giving this their active consideration, in the hope of coming up with some solutions. Only time will tell!

Finally, I express my thanks to all the coaches, managers, administrators and canteen personnel who have played their part in guiding us through another season. I make special mention of John Rompotis for his superhuman efforts in fundraising; Matthew de la Hunty for taking on the Secretary's job as well as team manager and, on occasions, coach; and Kevin Hall who also combined the Treasurer's position with his coaching duties.

As you can see, the club urgently needs a few more volunteers from among the ranks of the parents. The old saying "Many hands make light work" was never more appropriate than when applied to running a junior footy club. So, come on, parents, lets see a good roll up of new faces at our Annual General Meeting on Monday 8th October. You never know, you might snag the President's job!

My best wishes to you all for the rest of the year. See you again for season 2002!

Thank you, Mario, from the 14s and the club.



TOTAL 163

The total of 163 active registered players represents a decrease of 28% on our 2000 strength. This year there was a substantial drop in numbers due to a lack of sufficient players in the 13s, 15s and 17s age groups, which meant we were unable to field teams in those grades. The general drop off in numbers in the standard rules grades is alarming and clubs may have to look at some form of amalgamation or sharing of players in the near future.

New registrations for the year totalled 60 over all grades, a decrease of 29 over last year. This is in line with the club having three less senior sides this season.

Strong registrations in the 10s and 12s enabled us to field two teams in each of those grades. While the 10s teams sometimes struggled to field full-strength sides due to absences and illness, the 12s sides were very stable and should ensure we field at least one 13s team next year.



I would like to thank the under 9's for their assistance with providing players, when available. Vince Miraudo was always willing to help when he could.






