junior Coaching football something that I was lucky experience for the first time in 2003. During pre-season it looked like we were scratching for numbers, but a couple of late starters boosted our list to 18 for the first bounce. Some new players were welcomed to the club, namely Jamie Doddemead, Julian Kii, Alex Rajcevic and Josh Georgieff (returning). We also gained Scott Stewart who had previously been playing with an older age group. Coaching focussed on three main areas: - 1) Skill development of each player, including use of opposite hand/foot; 2) Team skills; and 3) Sportsmanship and sense of fair play. Happily, I believe we have performed strongly in all these areas. importantly, the team has generally been very competitive and the boys have enjoyed their footy.

Players rarely spent a full game in one position, with frequent moves between offensive, defensive, and midfield roles. Our backline held firm against some strong opposition, with Scott Stewart at full back using strength and fisting the ball huge distances, the tenacious Michael Corica superb at ground level, and Daniel McSweeney taking numerous saving marks. At halfback we saw a number of excellent performances from the always cool Mark Schaafsma, the determined running David Quain who loves to "break the lines", and the high-leaping Julian Kii on the flanks, supporting the sure hands and keen judgement of Simon Douglas at centre halfback. The midfield provided a lot of drive, with the determined Brendan Ford getting plenty of possessions often against bigger opponents, and elusive players Sam Begg and Alec Sara giving run and setting up forward thrusts. At half forward, specialist goal kicker Joev Miraudo ran riot and had a stellar year, first year player Jamie Doddemead got more of the ball with each game, and the agile Jack Boronovskis created opportunities for his team-mates. Strong work by Paddy Keeffe at centre half forward provided problems for the opposition. The forward line contested, crumbed, and kicked truly, with Josh Georgieff and Alex Rajcevic always dangerous in the pockets, and the improving Nelson Lyall providing a marking target in the square.

Throughout year the the boys supported each other. trained enthusiastically, and showed excellent on field behaviour. Handball skills improved, and we saw the occasional use of the opposite foot! Overall, as a reasonably small team, overhead marking has been a weakness, but is balanced by our ability at ground level and intelligent play-on brand of football. Next year we will aim to play more consistent footy, continue to improve our skills, and be highly competitive against all opponents.

Finally, I would like to thank all parents for their support and help through the year. Particular thanks go to Chris Sara (Manager and Assistant Coach) for a magnificent job, Stuart Sara for helping out as runner; and Kevin McSweeney who frequently helped out at training. The total of 196 active registered players represents an increase of over 7% on our 2002 strength.
