


PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Dear Parents,

Season 2004 has finally come to an end and it is with great pride that I report on a rather successful 2004 season. This year saw an expanded and more exciting competition known as the Royals Junior Football competition run under the auspices of the East Perth District Development Council as part of the WA Football Commissions plan to try and increase the number of boys and girls participating in Australian Rules Football.

This year saw the introduction of new clubs to our competition like Lansdale, Girrawheen, Cardinals, etc to name a few. The cut off age for players this year also changed to September 30.

This means that any child who has a birthday after that date will be eligible to play down an age group if they so desire.

This year we fielded teams in all age groups from Auskick to 17s Including two teams in the 9s age group. In total we had just under 250 boys and girls registered at our club an increase on just over 25% on last year. All our Junior grade teams had successful seasons with all boys and girls improving their skills and enjoying their games. In the youth grades all teams managed to have significant victories throughout the season with our 13s the most successful winning the 13s Country Carnival played during the mid year school holidays and taking out the "Lou Miraudo Cup" a challenge match played between Bombers and Ballajura. They are also playing in the finals of that competition this year. Our 14s – 17s won many games and were unlucky to miss out on the finals.

This year due some excellent fundraising, sponsorship and good financial management the club is in a sound position and was able to purchase jumpers for four of our teams with the remainder to be purchased for next season. We also provided teams with additional funds for extra sausage sizzles this year and related activities. The club is also looking to install some new floodlight towers at the oval to provide more adequate lighting so that the reserve can become a safer and better training facility for everyone.

The club is also in a better position with all youth coaching positions filled for next year and most of the junior grades. The club always welcomes more parents to become accredited coaches and managers.

Next year we will require a new Treasurer as our hardworking and dedicated Treasurer of the past three years Kevin Hall will be returning to coaching. Likewise, a new secretary is also required, with Matthew de la Hunty also moving onto other roles after 4 years. The club sincerely thanks both Matthew and Kevin for their dedication and hard work. The healthy position of the club is due in no small part to the contribution of these two men.

I would also like to thank Chris Prast one of our coaches for the significant contribution he has made in the coaching area to our club and many of our boys are better footballers as a result of his coaching prowess and knowledge.

Special thanks must also go to all coaches for 2004. Without their commitment and hard work your boys would not be able to play football. I would also like to thank the many people involved with the committee who have supported me, provided guidance and kept me in check when I needed to be. I would just like to say from myself personally and on behalf of the club thanks to:

AUSKICK REPORT

The season began the first week after the April school holidays in which approx 45 kids were involved on our first night. The kids were split into groups and were shown the basic fundamentals of our game for the first couple of weeks. On the third training night whilst the kids played a grid game we had a parents in service session with Mr Gavin Rose our East Perth District Junior Officer and the parents were shown a few tricks with a footy as well, a few laughs were had by all.

Our first big outing was in late May when we ventured to East Perth's home ground, Leederville Oval, to play a display grid game at half time of the East Perth v's Claremont league match. We had 45 kids and their parents turn out for the games and the air of nervous anticipation amongst the players was exciting and the proud look in their eyes as they ran onto the oval was something to remember. The fifteen odd minutes we had to play our game seemed to go forever, yet when the siren went it was a sudden "oh we've just started" feeling, but the kids, once back in the rooms, were quite satisfied with their efforts and thrilled for the opportunity to play on the "Big Boys" turf. A good afternoon had by all.

The next couple of weeks we did fundamentals training leading up to our club family day in which 35 boys and girls played a couple of grid games to get the day rolling.

June saw us travel to the home of the Morley Bulldogs for our first interclub match and we had a great turn out of 40 players and the kids really did themselves proud and showed the opposition that we could play good footy.

The next few weeks was back to the grind teaching different skills and we continued training during the July school holidays where about 25 players turned up on each night.

At the beginning of August we had our first "FOOTY BUS TRIP" to Bayswater Bears ground where the kids really had their first taste of winter conditions that can be experienced with this sport. As the heavens opened up several times during the game kids could be seen shivering, sliding in the mud, looking towards mum and dad with that "can we go now" expression and just the drowned rat look but truly their wet weather skills were unbelievably great. At the end of the day the kids proved they are learning and putting their skills together magnificently. (One thing should be remembered from this game is that up until this weekend we had seen rain only once (for about 10mins) for the whole footy season the funny thing about that was they all ran off the training track when the first spot of rain came down. It was very amusing to watch them scatter that night.).

Our last interclub game was against Nollamara Cougars at our ground on a cold but beautiful sunny mid August morning in which about 35 kids turned out and had a great time and again showed some excellent football skills.

Our season will culminate with a presentation day windup which will start with a grid game to finish off the season.

We had 58 kids for the season(18 up on last year) which is great for our club and football's future.

The season has been a very productive one and on reflection looking at the kids progress is very satisfying especially the 5/6 year olds, the 7 young girls and the couple of kids in general who until this year had never picked up a footy. Well done on your efforts. For the older kids who have been around the club this their second or third year your skills have also been great to watch and the way you have set an example for the younger kids with the enthusiasm and positive attitude that you've shown throughout the year. Well done.

Thankyou to the parents who have helped out during the year with training and at grid games as being my first time doing this having some help is essential so that everything runs smoothly. 12s COACH'S REPORT

The 12s have had a fantastic year, playing a brand of football that has made them the benchmark of the competition. Congratulations boys. Whilst there is no official score at this age group, and no league ladder, every kid knows the score and is definitely playing for a win. We were fortunate to win all our games except for one early in the season when we were overtaken in the final quarter after leading all game. Additionally we had a couple of convincing Little League wins at East Perth games, and were undefeated in the recent carnival.

Early signs for the year were good with a strong turnout at registration day. Greg Quain came on board as manager and assistant coach, and has been a huge asset. We welcomed 7 new players to the team this year, including strong centreline players Ashley Boyes and Steven Lee, classy defender Jake Dalli, hard tackling Perrin Knezavich, running marking halfback Blake Tilley (returning), clever elusive forward Billy Duncan (moving up an age group), and strong marking Tyronne Gibson. These new players have added intensity and mobility to a quality team which includes:- Scott Stewart, Mark Schaafsma, Simon Douglas, David Quain, Brendan Ford, Sam Begg, Jack Boronovskis, Jamie Doddemead, Paddy Keeffe, Joey Miraudo (54 goals!), Alec Sara, Nelson Lyall, and Josh Georgieff.

Coaching has continued to focus on the three main areas of:- 1) Skill development of each player, including use of opposite hand/foot; 2) Team skills; and 3) Sportsmanship and sense of fair play. This focus is starting to pay dividends. Multiple players are now confident to use their opposite foot (we had 9 players do this in one game alone!), a skill that is crucial to the development of a good footballer. We have shown excellent improvement in team play (back-up, shepherding, run-on support) and in our fast movement of the ball with precise foot passing and handball. The on-field behaviour of all players has been exemplary.

The year has provided plenty of highlights. Particularly pleasing has been the way the boys have won the ball through strong contesting, and when not in possession have put enormous pressure on the opposition (who could forget the game against Mt. Lawley!). Also pleasing has been the way the boys have persisted when things have not gone their way. This was illustrated by several come-from-behind wins, one from almost 5 goals down during the 3rd quarter. Our marking, not previously a strength, has improved dramatically over the year, to the point where we are often seeing strong single-grab marks. Players have shown great flexibility playing in a variety of positions.

Next year sees a new challenge:- the transition to full rules on a full ground, official scoring, a league ladder, and Best & Fairest voting. The full ground will suit our running, ball-sharing game, and I am confident that we will adapt well.

Finally, I would like to pay special thanks to Greg Quain for doing a great job, particularly when I have been absent. Thanks also to all parents for their support and help through the year. Let's look forward to singing the club song in 2005.
