


# PRESIDENT'S REPORT

As another season draws to an end we have time to reflect on our successes and future of the Bombers JFC. This year we fielded teams from Auskick through to the 16s grade with two sides in the 10s competition. All teams performed admirably with three out of our four youth grade teams making the finals - culminating in a premiership for our 13s side. Only the second team in the history of this club to do so with the last being the 13s team in 1998. In addition, the current healthy financial status of the club means we can continue to provide outstanding facilities, resources and equipment to all our teams.

For the first time this year the 12s were jointly coached by Wayne Hartzer and Kevin McSweeney. Following an influx of players and a slow start, the team finally gathered a bit of momentum and showed great improvement and progress during the year. The team was also fortunate to represent both East Perth and later in the season WC Eagles in Little League fixtures. With further improvement and hard work the team can look forward to a fruitful and successful transition into youth grade competition next season.

The 13s were coached by Graham Begg his third season with the team and ably supported by Greg Quain. The team enjoyed outstanding success throughout the season and after finishing third at the end of the home and away games swept all before them with some outstanding performances to beat Cardinals by 10 goals in the first final, then over ran the previously undefeated Cobras in the Second Semi before thumping Ballajura by five goals in the Grand Final to take out the 2005 13s premiership. Congratulations to the team and to Graham on being named this year's Bombers Team and Coach of the Year.

The 14s were lead by a newcomer to the coaching ranks, Kelvin Sharp, with assistance from Jim Vellios. After having played in a Grand Final in 2004 the team was unlucky this year to suffer both injuries and player losses, sometimes leaving them greatly undermanned. Whilst they played some outstanding footy and fought hard to make the finals, the team was knocked out in the Elimination Final. The team possesses a wealth of talent, and with indications of a bigger squad to choose from next year, and the further development of Kelvin as a coach, they are bound for greater success in 2006.

The 15s saw a return to coaching ranks by Kevin Hall. The team was part of a combined East Perth/Claremont competition, which was a strong and tough competition. With players having difficulties attending all training sessions and often having to play undermanned, wins were hard to come by. However, the team showed great improvement as the year progressed and their endeavour and effort could not be questioned. The team enjoyed some great individual performance with David Hall being rewarded with selection in the State schoolboys team.

The 16s also had a great season in a combined competition which saw them beat Marist for the first time ever and if not for a controversial point nearly beat the undefeated Ballajura team. The team progressed to the preliminary final and if were not for some bad luck could also have made a Grand Final appearance.

Congratulations to Leo Schaafsma and Chris Prast on a great job and coaching effort. Lets hope the team can stay together and take the next step and go all the way in 2006.

Highlights during the season included a number of WC Eagles players who came down to training and ran some drills and signed autographs for our youth grade teams while the junior grades were serviced by Essendon players who ran a clinic for those age groups earlier in the year. The club also announced the naming of the clubrooms and stand in honour of a great club stalwart in Charles Musca and from 2006 it shall be referred to as the "Charles Musca Stand". The floodlights are also finally up and running and with some tweaking of the ground for next season will make for a better Oval and training facility.

On a personal note I would also like to extend a special thanks to Chris and Jenny Sara for all their hard work during the season without whose efforts my job and the smooth running of the club would fail abysmally. Special thanks to Kendal O'Reilly and later Sandra Dalli for their efforts during the year to ensure the canteen was fully stocked and ran smoothly and to Errol Couch for ensuring I didn't miss a beat during the year, being our Ground Coordinator during the finals and organising trophies.

Many thanks to all the parents for supporting the club and who assisted with washing jumpers, providing oranges, acting as goal umpires, runners, boundary umps etc. Special mention to a group of people whose role is often over looked but by no means less important and that is our Managers who ensured team lists and payments etc were handled competently.

Finally special thanks to both Matthew de la Hunty as Secretary, fundraising and producing the Annual report, and Ted Boronovskis for developing and maintaining the website and digitising the club's history of photos. Matthew is looking to step down after 5 years of service — the longest serving Secretary in the club's history. Last but not least, our new Treasurer, Anne Ford has been a valuable addition to the committee this year.

The club can now look forward to a fruitful and productive 2006 season.

What a phenomenal year our 13s team has had, making the finals and winning the Premiership. After being the benchmark team of 2004, we faced a 2005 with 3 of our opposing clubs having combined their multiple teams. This promised tough opposition!

We began 2005 having retained every player from 2004, and added new players Marco "Mad dog" Marcello, Alex "Raging Bull" Rajcevic (returning), Kadin "Slippery" Bauer, Julian "Far out" Faraone, Josh "Whiteline Fever" Chiat (returning), Domanic "The Dominator" Matsumoto, and Scott "The Scrapper" D'Mello. This gave us a full list of 25, including established players Ashley Boyes, Steven Lee, Jake Dalli, Blake Tilley, Billy Duncan, Tyronne Gibson, Mark Schaafsma, Simon Douglas, David Quain, Brendan Ford, Sam Begg, Jack Boronovskis, Jamie Doddemead, Paddy Keeffe, Joey Miraudo, Alec Sara, Nelson Lyall, and Josh Georgieff.

We set our goals; basically improving individually and as a team, and significantly, making the finals. Finals would be one of several big challenges, along with adapting to full rules, full-sized grounds, and the tougher opposition. It has not been easy with 25 players balancing game time for all with our goal of on-field results, but I feel we have struck the right balance.

The transition to full ground size was initially pretty tough; clearly this stifled our flowing game style and goals were harder to conjure. Despite this we started off the year with solid wins, before an undermanned side went down to archrivals Mt Lawley. On the rebound we notched a 4 win streak (uncluding an 11 goal thrashing of Ballajura Blue), before going down narrowly to top side the Northern Cobras. We won 3 out of the next 4 (got our revenge on Mt. Lawley, but narrowly lost to Cardinals), before an undermanned side suffered our heaviest loss of the year (8 goals) to Ballajura Blue. A solid win over Bayswater locked us into third spot and delivered us the double chance for the finals. Our strengths included a top class group of midfielders, a solid and sometimes spectacular defense, hard-running wingers, and a well-balanced forward line. Our superior teamwork and ball use, coupled with a deserved reputation as the hardest tackling side in the competition, made us very competitive.

Congratulations to all players on a fine year. Making the finals (finishing third after the home and away series) is one thing, but to perform at a such a high level in the finals (beating 2<sup>nd</sup> placed Cardinals by 63 points; beating previously undefeated top team Northern Cobras by 23 points; and beating Ballajura Blue by 32 points in the Grand Final) is a superb achievement. This is a very good team and very worthy Premiers. Congratulations also to our trophy winners. Let's look forward to another big one in 2006.

A special thanks to Assistant Coach and Team Manager Greg Quain for his fantastic support and many hours of work. A big thanks also to Team Runner and Assistant Manager John Dalli, expert boundary umpire Phil Douglas, and everyone else who has pitched in. Thanks parents for your support, particularly understanding the constraints imposed by a 25 player list. In last year's report I said we should look forward to singing the club song in 2005. We did, and we enjoyed it. Go Bombers, go Premiers!
