It is great to see our senior teams arriving at their games all dressed in their Bombers team polo shirts, what an impressive sight! With the range of merchandise now available through the Club, it is now easy to identify members and this is great for the profile of our Club. Along with the polo shirts, the Club now sells rugby tops, caps, beanies and rain jackets.

Sales of all merchandise were steady this year. With this being the Club's 20th Anniversary a commemorative shiraz was introduced and there are still some bottles of this fine wine available. For a donation of \$7 it is a great keepsake to put away for your sons' in the future.

With the seven junior teams, four senior teams, Auskick and Bomberettes the home ground canteen has been very busy most weekends this year with a turn-over in excess of \$27,000. This has seen a profit to the Club of approximately \$12,000 and this will enable your Club to further improve facilities for your children.

I would like to sincerely thank the people who tirelessly volunteer their time in the canteen. Even though games do not start until 9am, there are a number of familiar faces who are there early each morning to help cut bread rolls, wrap muffins and stock the fridges. In particular I would like to thank Ann-Mary, Michelle, Morena, Kendal, Clem, Lisa, Olivia, Maria, Toni – I'm sure I've forgotten someone!

This season Bombers JFC were asked to host the Semi-Finals. This involved catering for sixteen teams, with the accompanying supporters and officials on two ovals. I would not have been able to organise this day without amazing and tireless support from Jenny Hartzer. Jenny was so calm and capable she made everything look so easy. A day like this would not have run as smoothly without the valuable assistance from all those who worked shifts in the canteen or cooked on the barbeque. A number of volunteers did not have sons playing senior football but still donated their time on Fathers Day, I'd also like to thank all the 17's players who stayed to help clean up at the end of a very long day. THANK YOU!!

I would also like to thank Jenny Sara for all her assistance with the upcoming kitchen renovations. Jenny has spent many many months dealing with various councils and committees to ensure every box is ticked and "i" dotted so that hopefully in season 2008 we will have a fabulous new kitchen — yeah!

I cannot thank enough each member of the club who has either purchased a muffin, washed a coffee cup or cooked a sausage this year. The club would not be as successful without your valuable support and assistance.

I have enjoyed managing the canteen this year and look forward to seeing you all next year — on either side of the counter!

The account s of the Bombers Junior Football Club will not be able to be finalised until after the modified and open rules team's trophy presentations all end of season expenses have been paid. A full financial report will be available at the Club's Annual General meeting to be held later in the year.

However, I can report that the club is in a sound financial position with a balance of \$10,169.46 on term deposit and an estimated cheque account balance by the end of the season of approximately \$20,000.00 (subject to confirmation).

This year's main fundraiser has been the Canteen with an expected profit of between \$10,000.00 to \$12,000.00 to be realised. The canteen has been well supported each week and profits are expected to be an increase on last year due to the Club hosting the first and second semi finals this year. It was a financially successful weekend.

The club has received approx \$2280.00 in sponsorship for the 2007 year. We were successful in receiving a grant through the Grow the Game Funding Grant Program of \$3000.00 in addition to this sponsorship.

Many thanks and appreciation must go to our sponsors who have been mentioned in this Annual Report.

Our major event this year was our 20th Anniversary Dinner. This was not intended to be a big fundraiser, but a celebration of the last 20 years of the Bombers Junior Football Club. By all accounts this was a successful night with a cost of \$700 to the club.

We have been successful in receiving a grant from the City of Stirling, together with our own contribution we will have approximately \$30,000.00 to renovate our kitchen. This project is expected to be completed by the start of the 2008 season.


