Our 14s had a magnificent season making the Grand Final for the second successive season. Unfortunately, they could not replicate their 13s Grand Final win and despite the scores being level at half time they eventually went down to Ballajuma by 5 goals. Special thanks must go to Laurie Hart and his team of helpers, Piero Liscia, Lul Scaldeferro, Kevin McSweeney and to Erica Liscia for assisting with first aid. I'm sure the team will be back bigger and better next season and hopefully reverse the tables and play in a third consecutive Grand Final.

No doubt some potential champions will emerge from this team. A great indication of the evenness of this team is that no player finished in the top six in the district Fairest and Best, yet the team played off in a Grand Final.

### TREASURERS REPORT 2007

The account s of the Bombers Junior Football Club will not be able to be finalised until after the modified and open rules team's trophy presentations all end of season expenses have been paid. A full financial report will be available at the Club's Annual General meeting to be held later in the year.

However, I can report that the club is in a sound financial position with a balance of \$10,169.46 on term deposit and an estimated cheque account balance by the end of the season of approximately \$20,000.00 (subject to confirmation).

This year's main fundraiser has been the Canteen with an expected profit of between \$10,000.00 to \$12,000.00 to be realised. The canteen has been well supported each week and profits are expected to be an increase on last year due to the Club hosting the first and second semi finals this year. It was a financially successful weekend.

The club has received approx \$2280.00 In sponsorship for the 2007 year. We were successful in receiving a grant through the Grow the Game Funding Grant Program of \$3000.00 in addition to this sponsorship.

Many thanks and appreciation must go to our sponsors who have been mentioned in this Annual Report.

Our major event this year was our 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Dinner. This was not intended to be a big fundraiser, but a celebration of the last 20 years of the Bombers Junior Football Club. By all accounts this was a successful night with a cost of \$700 to the club.

We have been successful in receiving a grant from the City of Stirling, together with our own contribution we will have approximately \$30,000.00 to renovate our kitchen. This project is expected to be completed by the start of the 2008 season.



#### REPORT SUPPLIED MR BILL FORREST - FORMERLY COOBINIA JFC

It is my pleasant duty to be invited here tonight to speak on the early formation and history of the Coolbinia – Yokine Junior Football Club.

It only seems like yesterday but back in 1969 I was the Secretary of Coolbinia.

In the Annual Report of 1970 I wrote a brief history of the club and this was also included in an updated version that was part of the dub's history that appeared in the 1981 annual report that was presented to celebrate Coolbinia's 21 years as a junior football club.

The Club right from its first year of acceptance into the East Perth Junior Council was a very proud and successful junior football club. I could talk for a considerable time about the achievements of players and the dedication of many outstanding officials. However, this is a night for celebration of the formation of the Bombers Junior Football Club and rather than boring you all I will restrict my comments to a few of the highlights that have occurred over the years.

The foundation of the club initiated from a meeting that was convened by Mr Neville Reynolds who at the time was President of the East Perth Junior Football Council and a beacher at Coolbinia Primary School..

The meeting was held at the Coolbinia Primary School on November 24, 1960.

A number of interested parents attended the meeting and it was decided to call an inaugural meeting on December 15, 1960. There was a large attendance of boys and parents at this meeting and the following parents were elected as Office Bearers for the 1961 season. President: Mr Les Barnes, Vice Presidents: Mr S Griffiths and Mr Len McCarthy, Sec/Treasurer: Mr Max White, Committee: Messrs Bruce Daniel, A Meaton, A Naismith and Alex Barras

It is now 46 years since the club's first season and I believe most of these officials have passed away.

Len McCarthy who is aged 89 still lives in Marradong Street Coolbinia and

Bruce Daniel who is aged 86 still lives in Rothsay Cres opposite Alexander Park Oval.

There were several suggestions regarding the naming of the Club. These included:

The Scaddan L.F.C. and the Alexander Park J.F.C. It was finally decided that Coolbinia — Yokine would be the most appropriate name as the original intention in creating the Club was to cater for the youth of both districts.

The club was accepted into the East Perth Junior Football Council in early 1961 and teams were entered in the 14 and 16 grades. The nucleolus of the two teams was drawn from the Alexander Park Football Club for juniors that for a number of years had been conducted by Laurie Bandy.

The Club's home ground in 1961 was at Alexander Park.

The ground was a far cry from the facilities that the
Bombers now enjoy at their Bradford Street ground.

Alexander Park was a very small ground that sloped downhill, there were no change rooms, seating or shelter from the rain. The officials and players were obviously a very dedicated and hardy group because they suffered the lack of proper facilities for over a decade. The club was a very proud club and right from their beginning they had a great deal of success on the playing field. In their first year of competition the 14's coached by Norm Ashton won the premiership.

During the 1961 and 1962 seasons the club was known as the Coolbinia — Yokine Under 14 and Under 16 Football Club. A decision was made to form an under 18 team and players from the Northern Districts Temperance Club merged with Coolbinia—Yokine and the name of the club was changed to the Coolbinia—Yokine Junior Football Club. From this point onwards the club and the players enjoyed considerable success both on and off the field.

In 1964 The 12's grade competition was inaugurated. This was in the years prior to - the modified game that you all know today - The 12's played open rules. The club team played off in the Grand Final and was defeated by Inglewood. The 14's team coached by John Gallagher won the premiership by defeating Mount Lawley.

Ross Hogan the captain of the 14's scored another first for the club by winning the East Perth Junior Council's Fairest & Best Award. At the end of the 1965 season the 18's team went on tour to Melbourne. Several matches were played in Melbourne. The 14's team captained by John Daniel and coached by John Gallagher won the Grand Final for the second successive year.

The year of 1966 is one that supporters, officials and players will long remember regarding the 16's team and many say this was the best team that the club ever produced and perhaps the unluckiest.

The team that was coached by Bob Boucher was undefeated in qualifying rounds.

In the second semi-final Coolbinia easily accounted for Inglewood.

The Grand Final was played against CBHS, in cold, wet and blustery conditions. At the final siren scores were equal. The game was then decided by a further two quarters of ten minutes each. CBHS had first use of the breeze and went on to win a low scoring game by the narrowest of margins. Unfortunately in all the disappointment the final scores were never entered in the teams book. Bill Boucher won the award for the District Fairest and Best in the 16's

In 1967 after completing a period of four years as President of the club, Bruce Daniel retired and my good friend and neighbour, Bill Crowe, took over the position. Two of the club's outstanding footballers namely John Daniel and Paul Cook were selected in the State Schoolboys team. John gained a further honour in being selected in the All-Australian team,

Before the 1968 fixtures were about to commence Bill Crowe approached Lisle Bremner, the secretary of the Junior Council, and advised him that the club was unable to find enough players to field an 18's team and although the fixtures had been drawn up the club would have to withdraw their nomination.

Bremner's reply to Bill Crowe was — "Well Bill, if you withdraw your team now your club will not be able to nominate another 18's team for a period of two years." With this threat in his mind Bill Crowe returned to the club with the news and it was decided to make a concerted effort to recruit more players.

At the start of the season the team was able to muster the bare 18 players and the team managed to front up each week with the help of a couple of reserves from the 16's. The calibre of the players in the team was such that during the season the team won their share of games and finished second on the premiership ladder.

In the 2<sup>nd</sup> Semi-final Inglewood easily accounted for Coolbinia. In the Preliminary Final Coolbinia defeated East Perth-Highgate by 20 points.

The Grand final was played at Hillorest Oval. The best Coolbinia could muster was 18 players plus two 16's reserves. Inglewood was the red-hot favourite to take out the premiership. In a thrilling finish Coolbinia coached by Brian Pasco held on to win by 11 points and record the club's first premiership in the 18's competition.

Bill Crowe has a hard job living down the fact that team he had wished to withdraw due to lack of numbers had eventually won the premiership. To add to a very successful year. Bob Noble coached the 12's to a premiership win

Graeme Radford achieved another first for the dub when he won the award for the East Perth district fairest and best in the 12's grade.

The Daniel family had another success added to their long list of Junior football achievements when John won the award for the East Perth district fairest and best award for the 18's.

In 1969 I took over the position of secretary from Les James. During his three years as secretary Les performed his duties in a most workmanlike manner and his forethought and wisdom in collating a set of dub records from the inauguration of the club has been invaluable in creating a record of players and officials who had been associated in the early years of the club. I must have been a jinx because 1969 was the first time since 1964 that one of our players failed to win a District Fairest and Best Award.

1969 also saw the end of the "Daniel Era" the excellent work done by father Bruce was matched on the playing field by his four sons. Brian, Peter, Geoffrey and John. Between them the boys played a total of 321 games for the club and in doing so won three East Perth District Fairest and Best awards and nine Club Fairest and Best awards. A distinction unparalleled in the history of the Club. John eventually played 155 league games with East Perth and was a member of the 1978 premiership team.

In 1970 Bob Noble brought further fame to the dub when he coached the 14's to a Premiership success. 1971 was my last year as secretary of the dub. At the same time the W.A.F.L. boundary re-distribution was a period in the history of the dub.

The club continued to receive great assistance from many dedicated parents who served on the club's executive. Life membership was bestowed on Kelth London, Mick Curtis, Reg Wray, Don Ken and Tom O'Farrell.

Premierships in the under 18's in 1975, 1978 and 1979 brought further glory to the club.

Jamie Daniels created a new record for the number of games played for the club when he posted bitter blow to the club when we lost the district of Yokine and a number of promising young players. Despite our losses it was most encouraging to witness the great club spirit that prevailed during a most worrying period.

1972 saw the opening of the new premises at Bradford Street and this was the start of a new 167 games played 1972 –1981 and in doing so he passed the record of 163 games previously recorded by Graeme Washbourne.

In 1981 the club celebrated the 21st celebration of the inauguration of the club and the Saturday night "Back to Coolie" was a great success and enabled players, officials and parents to meet and reflect on years gone by. Since 1981 Former Presidents namely Bill Crowe, Max White, Trevor Sheard, Fred Kirkman, Bill Canning and John Wright are all deceased and many other stalwarts including Bob Stewart, Reg Wray and Neville Reynolds have also passed away.

From 1978 when the club fielded five teams and had 120 registered players, numbers began to fall away and eight years later in 1987 the dub was only able to field 10's, 12's and 15's with a total of 55 registered players. Amalgamation appeared to be the only way the club known as Coolbinia – Yokine could survive.

The amalgamation of Coolbinia and Dianella eventuated and resulted in the formation of the Bombers Junior Football Club. A further 20 years on and it is to the credit of the coaches and executive members of the Bombers that the club in season 2007 is catering for over 350 boys and girls in the Auskick competition and 11 teams ranging in ages from 9's through to 17's.

I offer my congratulations for a magnificent performance at Coolbinia and for that manner also the Bombers have produced a number of players who have played no more than a maximum of 4 league football games excepting only Russell Argent (12 games) John Bandy (96Games) Spiro Mailis (48) and John Daniel (155) but when it comes to producing Teachers, Dentists or Doctors we are up with the best.

I sincerely hope that amongst this great influx of 2007 kids there a number who will go on to play extended league or even AFI, football careers.
