CANTEEN/MERCHANDISE REPORT 2008

What a great start to the season in the clubrooms! Thanks to a lot of hard work from Jenny Sara together with the City of Stirling the clubrooms received a long overdue makeover and we now have a brand new modern kitchen area with a very nice stove, streamlined storage cupboards, new lino and even a new rolladoor.

Sales of all merchandise were steady this year and the black and red polos are now a familiar sight as our teams arrive at games in their Bombers shirts. Along with the polo shirts the Club also sells rugby tops, caps, beanies, rain jackets, socks and this year introduced a footy kit bag. With Bomberettes, Auskick, seven junior and five senior/youth teams the home ground canteen has been busy most weekends with a turn-over of approximately \$30,000. This has seen a profit to the club of almost \$13,600 and these funds have enabled your Club to improve facilities for your kids with further improvements to come.

Even though games do not start until 9am the morning starts much earlier in the canteen with cutting all the rolls, wrapping muffins and cookies and stocking fridges and shelves. I would sincerely like to thank all those who tirelessly volunteer their time in the canteen, some who do not have children playing in the early games but who arrive early just to help out. All those who give time in the canteen are always warmly welcomed and you do get a free cuppa. With the growing number of families in our Club you may only be rostered on once a year to cook the barbeque or work half a game in the canteen but your time is so appreciated by the Club and especially your children.

This year we have also had Lawrence Behr from Mokador Coffee at all our home games. Lawrence gives \$1 back to the club from every coffee or hot chocolate that he sells and I know some of us have appreciated his strong coffee on those early mornings...

The canteen would not run as smoothly without all the valuable assistance I have received throughout the year. In particular I would like to thank Kendal, Morena, and Clem for all their support and for running the canteen so I can occasionally go home!

Just a reminder – the canteen is very happy to have senior school students working to complete their community service hours. Thank you this year to Lachlan, Olivia and Georgia who have worked many hours cooking sausages and washing cups.

I have enjoyed managing the canteen this year and I do look forward to seeing you all next year - on either side of the counter. Rachel McSweeney

TREASURERS REPORT 2008

Season 2008 has been a successful year financially for the Club.

We have paid, jointly with the City of Stirling, to upgrade the Clubs canteen kitchen at a cost to the club of \$10,000.00.

A further \$9,000.00 has been spent on updating the clubs jumpers, player equipment, and capital purchases for the new canteen.

Sponsorship this year totaled \$3150.00, for which we are very grateful. Plans are in place to increase this sponsorship for the 2009 season. On top of this generous cash donation sponsorship we have also received \$1051.00 from the coffee sales of the Mokador coffee van which attends the games on the weekend. The club has also received many "in kind" sponsorship from of our suppliers.

Our major sponsor Allmark has again come forward and assisted the club with very generous discounts and donations of equipment, supplies and services to the club – totaling well in excess of \$2000.00

All of our sponsors are mentioned in this Annual and we ask that you support them as they have supported us over the 2008 season.

The club has on term deposit a balance \$10,690.00. This money has been allocated to go towards the payment of another light tower for the oval. This will be of great value to the players and coaches on training nights — in particular the Youth grades.

Again the Canteen has been the major earner of income for the Club with the Canteen making a net profit of \$13,600. Thanks must go to our Canteen Coordinator – Rachel McSweeny and to all members of the club who supported the canteen each week.

Subject to payment of end of year accounts it is expected that the Club will have an ending bank balance of \$16,000.00 to start off the 2009 year with. Leaving the club with a close to breakeven situation for the 2008 season.

Final reports on the financial position will be tabled and available at the Annual General Meeting.
