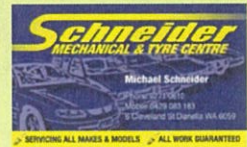

# PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Our year has flown past. We fielded 4 Youth teams, 5 Modified teams (one less than last year), a Junior Girls team, and another record number of Auskickers (176), including 17 Bomberettes. Behind all this our army of volunteers did a brilliant job. We should all be proud of our Club's culture. In a year where the AFL put enormous stress on Game Day Environment, our long history of insisting on high standards of behavior and sportsmanship meant that we just went about our business as usual.

The season started on a sad note when one of our little Auskickers, Kael Holman, passed away from illness. Our deepest sympathies are with the Holman family. Terrible events such as this remind us all how fragile life can be, and to treasure the opportunity to have fun with our kids.

Wayne French and team delivered another superb Auskick season. The kids seem hungry for more, and can look forward to an exciting 2012 season building on the skills they have learned. Improved skill acquisition is key to boosting the players' confidence and keeping participation rates high (the key success metric of our club) all the way through to the senior Youth grades. The Bomberettes were again prominent under the great coaching of John Murray, and overall the number of girls continues to build.

There were plenty of fantastic Modifieds (Year 4's to Year 7's) games this year, and it great to see these young players work together, take the game on, and really enjoy themselves. The coaching message was overwhelmingly positive and constructive. Keep listening to your coaches kids, work on your skills, and come back next year ready to play more brilliant footy. Remember, practice makes perfect – keep the footy pumped up and handy over summer, then surprise your team mates next year with some new skills and tricks. The difference in skill level between kids that pick up the footy at home regularly and those that don't emphasizes this point.

Our Junior Girls, led by coach John Worthy, also tasted competition again this year and by all accounts seem to be going from strength to strength. We'd love to see even more girls participating (there were 16 this year), so if you know someone who might enjoy a fun game of footy, please encourage them to come down next year. It would be great to have 2 teams.

At the time of writing we have our 14s Youth team coached by Brendan Hodge still in the finals race. Competition has been a lot tougher for the boys this year, but they have formed a very tight unit who share the ball very well. Good luck boys in your quest for back to back premierships. Our 15s, coached by Jim Vellios, bowed out in the first week

of finals after coming up against very strong opposition. Disappointing for the boys, but such challenges are the ones we learn the most from. Our 13s, coached by Gary Kirby, came into the season undermanned, but toughed it out and improved significantly as the season progressed. The 16s, coached by Brett Callanan, played the year missing almost the entire goal to goal line and ruck division from last year. Despite this, they were competitive and finished the year strongly. Resilience, discipline, persistence, initiative, selflessness, and higher performance are characteristics much more likely to be learned from doing it tough, than not being sufficiently challenged.

From an events perspective we have hosted very successfully the Year 2 Gala day and the 1<sup>st</sup> week of Youth finals. Thanks to all those who came down and helped out. The President's Night, to reward our army of volunteers, was a great success once again, thanks principally to Helen Watson and Clem Nicolson. A particular thanks also to Clem for stepping in to coordinate the canteen this year after our long-serving coordinator Rachel McSweeney resigned to have a tilt at Masterchef on tv. Well done Rach for going so far into the series.

In other news we have made solid progress towards getting a 4<sup>th</sup> light tower for next season. We have approval from City of Stirling (C of S) and our dealings with Western Power have been very fruitful after an initial setback. We are now waiting to hear if our grant application with the Department of Sport & Recreation (DSR) has been successful. If so, we will split the \$55,000 cost 3 ways with DSR and C of S. Thanks to club member Lindsay Dick and his company DCE Electrical for helping us get this far. Fortunately, years of good management means we have the cash and are ready to go once approval is received.

On the finance side the club was successful in getting 2 grants (thank you City of Stirling and Healthways). **A big thank you to our sponsors**, who continued their strong support. Particular thanks to our Platinum sponsor City Motors Holden and our Gold Sponsors Kensington Partners (for Taxation and Business Services), IGA X-Press (205 Flinders St., Yokine), Edge Drilling WA, and Schneider Mechanical & Tyre Centre (6 Cleveland St., Dianella). **Please remember that anyone connected with our club who buys a car from City Motors Holden will receive a \$200 fuel voucher.** This support is greatly appreciated, and will help us provide quality equipment and facilities for all, as well as training programs for our volunteers. Errol is in the running for the WAFC Volunteer of the Year, with the winner receiving a trip to the AFL Grand Final. Go Errol!

Thank you to all our volunteers, in particular the committee, coaches, assistant coaches and managers. Every player and parent is indebted to you for your fantastic contribution. In news just to hand I am very pleased to announce that Wayne French has won the **NAB AFL Auskick Volunteer of the Year Award for WA**. He wins a trip to the AFL Grand Final and is in the running for a trip to Europe! Congratulations Wayne – you are a deserving winner and the whole Club celebrates your award.

Congratulations to award winners, and to players who reached 50 and 100 game milestones. I wish everyone an enjoyable off-season. We look forward to seeing you again next year, either as a player or a volunteer.

# REGISTRAR'S REPORT

During the 2011 season we have seen 178 players participate from Year 4 through to 16's. During the season we fielded teams in the following Age Groups:

Unfortunately, despite a big effort being put into getting a 17's team up for the 2011 season we were unable to get sufficient numbers for a team. During the 2011 season our 15's and 16's participated in a Cross District competition with the Perth district (i.e. teams in the East Perth district played against teams in the Perth district).

On top of the 178 players who have played in Juniors and Youth grades we have our Junior & Youth Girls as well as our Auskickers (including Bomberettes) who participate within the Club.

Over the last couple of years we have seen a decline in the number of Junior and Youth players at the Club which we need to turn around. As we approach the 2012 season we need to see some strong recruitment of players for the 13's and 14's side for 2012 as well as a general increase in the number of Junior players (i.e. Yr4 through to Yr 7). All current players and parents in these age groups should be involved in the recruitment process which needs to start NOW. Players should start talking to their mates about coming down to Coolbinia Bombers next season.

Despite players numbers being lower than the Club would prefer in the Junior Age Groups and 13's all teams during the 2011 season were able to complete the season with some players filling in for other teams where it was practical to do so. Moving forward, it is preferable for all teams to be 'self sufficient'.

In closing, I would like to thank all Team Managers (and Coaches) for their continued assistance in providing me with information to allow me to keep on top of the Registrations and Game Tallies. It has been appreciated.
