Registrar's Report 2012

This year the Club fielded 3 teams in the Youth Grades and 5 teams in the Junior Grades. In the Youth Grades we fielded a Year 8, Year 10 and Year 12 team. Our Year 12 team also included a number of Year 11 aged players. All up we had 74 registered Youth players. In the Junior Grades we fielded one Year 4, Year 5 and Year 7 team and two Year 6 teams. All up we had 85 registered Junior players.

This year the East Perth District implemented Age Groupings across all Grades to align with the school years. So, instead of having 13's through to 17's the District had Year 8 through to Year 12. Previously, this was being grad-ually introduced through the younger Age Groups. In light of this change and taking into account the way that our registration numbers 'fell out' in the Junior Grades, the Club undertook an exercise to realign all players (in the main) into their correct Age Group. We would like to acknowledge the support of Coaches, Team Managers and Parents in successfully managing this transition which, at the end of the day, was in the best interests of the Players and the Club. On the note of player numbers, ideally, the Club would like to have two teams in each of the Junior Grades with an ideal number of players in each Junior team being around 18 players (with a minimum of 15) and a squad of around 25 players in Youth teams. Having two Junior teams places the Club in a good position to field a Youth team with good numbers when players move from Year 7 into Year 8.

This year the Club embarked on a player recruitment program by providing \$40 EB Game Vouchers to any players who introduced a new player to the Club. This resulted in 11 new players coming to the Club through the efforts of their mates and \$440 of EB Game Vouchers being shared amongst our existing player group. This incentive will continue into the 2013 season in an effort to continue to increase our player numbers, particularly in the Junior Grades.

In closing I would like to thank all Team Managers for their assistance and ongoing communication during the season which has assisted me greatly in keeping on top of things.

I look forward to doing it all again in the 2013 season; in the meantime enjoy the off season and stay safe.
