REGISTRAR'S REPORT 2013

This year we registered 197 players in our Youth, Juniors, Junior Girls (only) and Sunday Mod's grades. On top of this we had 216 registered Auskickers (including 42 Bomberettes).

In our Youth grades we fielded a team in Year 8 and Year 11 in our own right. Because the number of registered players for our Year 9 team was not sufficient to field a team we linked up with Mt Lawley (who were short on having numbers for two teams) to field a combined side Coolbinia /Mt Lawley Boomers which participated in the Year 9 competition. This was a great outcome for all concerned, retaining kids in our great game.

In our Junior grades, for the first time ever, the Club fielded three Year 4 teams. On top of this we had two Year 7 teams and one Year 5 and Year 6 team. The combined Year 7 numbers from the 2013 season (29) will hold them in good stead next year when they move to open rules in Year 8. Over the next couple of years we will need to explore initiatives to increase our Year 5 and Year 6 player numbers so that when these teams move to open rules the teams will remain viable.

The Junior Girls (only) team consists of players from Year 4 to Year 7. We had 15 registered Junior Girls (only) players.

This year the Club:

- Introduced a Sunday Mod's program for junior aged players who are unable to play football Saturday's. This initiative is aimed at attracting players who would otherwise be lost to our game and, hopefully retaining them within the Club through to Year 8 when they can continue their football in the Youth grades. We had 9 registered Sunday Mod's players.
- Continued with the player recruitment program by providing \$40 EB Game Vouchers to any players who introduced a new player to the Club. This resulted in 22 new players coming to the Club through the efforts of their mates and \$880 of EB Game Vouchers being shared amongst our existing player group.

Thanks again to all the Team Managers for their ongoing assistance and communication during the year. This has made my job a lot easier.

Enjoy the off season before we get to do it all again next year.

YEAR 9 COACH'S REPORT

In almost every competition across the country, Year 9 is the most challenging year for any footballer. The range of ability, growth and attitude amongst all players is often vastly different.

2013 was a very challenging year for my group of players. The season began with a merger between both the Coolbinia and Mt Lawley football clubs to form a unique alliance, the Coolbinia/ Mt Lawley Boomers. I would personally like to acknowledge the efforts of all Coolbinia and Mt Lawley officials and parents who supported the alliance and ensured all 28 players could play out the season each week. The first half of the season resulted in new friendships and understanding on how to meet expectations.

Several early matches were faced against potent opposition, who were intent on humiliating and disrespecting our team on the field. I'm proud to this day that our boys never sunk to that level and always maintained their dignity.

Mark Milazzo was appointed my assistant for 2013 and outlines some of his thoughts on the season:

"The Boomers have enjoyed mixed fortunes in season 2013. Being effectively a new and unfamiliar group, a significant orientation period was required. The players gelled together and gradually as the season progressed, order was instilled.

There can be no argument that the Year 9 competition unfortunately lacked balance, with several extremely strong clubs dominating. Nevertheless, the team showed determination and resilience, finishing the season with 6 wins and a solid sixth on the table, below Mt Lawley on fifth. A number of our players showed dramatic development as the season progressed. This aspect of coaching is most gratifying. It is somewhat ironic that our very last game saw our best performance and a feeling that we were now a truly competitive side that could put up a good showing against the best".

Physically, we were probably four bigger bodied players away from being a finals side. Injuries were also a constant thorn in the side. It felt like every Saturday before a game I was always getting a string of text messages noting me of unavailable players.

This was my first season as outright coach, after completing my Level 2 accreditation. It was very challenging and on occasions I did get highly emotive on the sideline. I like to think that I instilled a physical approach to the boys that can aid them in future seasons.
