PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2021

As season 2021 comes to a close and we have had the opportunity as a club to reflect on the season that was, it has been a reminder of how fortunate we have been as a community to have been able to come together each weekend and enjoy participating in a game we all love.

This season we fielded 23 teams which comprised 20 Coolbinia Bombers Teams, 2 Coolbinia/Mt Hawthorn Year 11/12 boys teams and a Baysie-Bombers Year 11/12 Girls team. It was wonderful to replicate last season whereby we were again able to achieve a pathway for all players from Years 3-12. Auskick and Starkick goes from strength to strength with an increase in players, across the club this year we have experienced a greater than 10% increase in total membership, with a total player membership of 680. A very big thank you to our Club Registrar Chloe Cushing for the enormous amount of support and voluntary work she has provided. It has been a huge task and we sincerely thank you. Our Auskick Coordinators Lauren Peake and Jacqui Quinn-Smith have again been magnificent in running the Auskick Programme, we thank you both for your wonderful two years of service to the club in this role. Also to Rob Geersen not only for his continued support as our past President but as Starkick Coordinator and all that he brings to the programme.



The ongoing growth has brought into sharp focus the need for rapid assessment and improvements across our club infrastructure in order to manage our already overstretched resources. The committee have been working closely with the City of Stirling and have progressed plans with short and long term storage solutions and I am pleased to report as we completed our end of season pack up we were fortunate to take delivery of our new short term solution of a sea container which has massively relieved the pressure and will make the work for volunteers and coaches much easier. Special thanks to the City of Stirling Infrastructure team and Councillors Joe Ferrante and Suzanne Migdale for their assistance.

This year we applied for and were fortunate to receive a grant through the City of Stirling - the City of Stirling Sporting Assistance Fund. The grant will be utilised for the installation of higher specification full size oval goalposts, the installation will progress in the pre-season next year and I'm sure our players and spectators look forward to this improvement in the game day experience. The installation of our fantastic new signage at the front of the clubrooms and in the home changerooms added some vibrancy and messaging, thanks to the players who voted last year on the choice of messaging for their changerooms, thank you to all involved in the completion of this project.

Like the experience of many sporting clubs, oval space remains a constant challenge and we continue to work closely with our partners to achieve the best solutions available to us. As always we are grateful to the Coolbinia Amateur Football Club for their generosity in sharing resources and a special thanks to Noranda Hawks Junior Football Club who hosted Friday night matches for our Girls teams with our oval at capacity with fixturing.

Season 2021 saw us celebrate as a community club with the ability to return to our traditional one club events with highlights including:

- Season Launch and Merchandise night which saw hundreds of hoodies, shorts and socks handed out as well as Coolbinia Oval #1 packed with players, families and friends enjoying food and activities. As always Michelle North our Merchandise Coordinator worked tirelessly to ensure players were kitted out for the season, thank you Michelle for always providing support and giving to so many. Thank you to Shauna Pearson our Social Coordinator again for putting the fun into the Season Launch and the seasons social activities, greatly appreciated.
- Scratch Match Round - fast becoming a season highlight, this year we hosted 13 matches running from early morning into the evening on the Saturday and concluding with a further morning of matches on the Sunday. It was a great weekend of football and celebration as our neighbouring Coolbinia Amateur Football Club also were celebrating the opening of their newly renovated Clubrooms.
- NAIDOC Round - celebrated in conjunction with our Auskick Buddy Round, players and families enjoyed a smoking ceremony and Indigenous food tastings along with Auskickers and Starkickers being led with their skills sessions by our Modified and Youth players.

On Field along with achieving in the club's core areas of participation, retention and growth, we experienced some notable highlights:

REGISTRAR'S REPORT 2021

I feel like I settled into my role a little more this year being my second season as the Registrar. The pre-season saw some new processes implemented by the WAFC which made for a bit more of a 'cray-cray' planning period. But once the season settled in the new processes made life much easier in certain areas.

It was fantastic to have so much support from all the club volunteers as well as parents who offered to put their hand up and help when needed. We had great retention and welcomed an abundance of new faces to our club.

Early registrations had a great impact on being able to plan ahead of time so that we could settle into the 2021 season with ease.

This year we once again fielded a team in every year group across our boys and girls competitions. We had a total of 23 teams again this year which included our two combined Coolbinia/Mt Hawthorn Teams under our Merge Agreement with the Mt Hawthorn Cardinals, as well as a combined Year 11/12 Girls Team for the first time with the Bayswater Bears.

I didn't think we could do it again, but we did...we broke our record number of registrations for the season! We were up 74 registrations from 2020 across our Auskick, Bomberettes, Starkick, Mods Boys, Youth Boys, Mods Girls and Youth Girls Teams.

TREASURER'S REPORT 2021

Thank you, Kyla. What a difference a year can make!

In 2021, the Coolbinia Bombers Junior Football Club bounced back from an interrupted 2020 with a strong showing both on the field and on the books.

The club recorded a net profit of \$11,810.51 for the financial year. Total income for the year was \$190,667.18, which was just over \$26,000 higher than anticipated, thanks to strong showings in registrations, canteen sales, and sponsorship. Because of the higher than anticipated registrations, there were more players and teams than originally expected, which meant higher than anticipated costs related to WA Football Commission registration and insurance fees, player events and awards, canteen supplies to feed the extra players and their families.

Our cost of sales was \$41,710.25, over \$7,500 higher than budgeted, and total operating expenses was \$8,951.42 higher than anticipated, at \$139,886.42.

Costs related to the purchase of footies, playing jumpers, and other equipment was substantially higher than originally forecast, due, in the main, to the requirements attached to some of the sponsorship and grants received. So, while expenditure on these items is higher than anticipated, their impact on the overall financial position is directly offset by the sponsorship and grants. Purchasing these items in 2021, will take some of the pressure off the 2022 budget.

Overall, the club's expenditure was \$8,951.42 over budget for the financial year, which was fully offset by the additional income received.

At the AGM last year, I indicated the club had put aside up to \$15,000 for the installation of new goal posts; as Kyla has already indicated, the club has successfully applied to the City of Stirling for a grant to cover these costs, which is great news for the club financially. The goal posts are scheduled for installation prior to the commencement of the 2022 season.

The committee is, once again, turning its attention to assessing where to allocate the surplus funds. One opportunity is the expansion of the club rooms to include much needed additional storage, and scoping for this has commenced.

At last year's AGM it was also pointed out that, in light of the size of the club's turnover, we were obliged to register for GST. In preparing for registration this year, it was acknowledged that, in previous years although the club's total turnover was at the threshold of the requirement to register for GST, a portion of the sponsorship and grants income were exempt from GST, essentially bringing us back from the threshold.

While a similar scenario was expected across 2021, a strong last few months see us now comfortably over the threshold. During the off-season the club plans to work with accountants, Kensington Partners, to ensure the smooth transition to GST registration.

The club's continued strong financial position is a community achievement, however, our outgoing canteen manager, Dani, and sponsorship coordinator, Shawn, have been instrumental to this achievement, and you leave very large shoes to fill, and you will both be missed.

I acknowledge the support the whole committee has provided to the club to make it what it is, and for providing me with the support I need to undertake this role, with special thanks to Kyla, our President, and Michael our vice-president. Thank you.

Periods of that contribution must show an impact and benefit to the wider club, not just solely service given to the one team or group.

YEAR 6 RED REPORT

2021 was our last year of Modified Footy and the focus again this year was to improve each boy's skills in the fundamentals of the game in readiness of youth footy next year, this included accurate kicking, strong marking, effective handballs along with additional consideration of where to setup on field during the game and to ensure we were in every contest and we were all pleased with the continued improvement shown this season. With a disrupted preseason and a couple new faces in the team we found ourselves unprepared for what the competition threw at us in round one, so we went back to the very basics and worked hard on our brand of footy. We lived by a simple set of rules, attack the footy in pairs, give 2nd efforts, have clean hands and kick (or handball) to the best option and I'm happy to say when we played this brand of footy we were competitive in every game. All of our players bought into this approach and it showed on game day. The 2021 Year 6 competition had 2 groups of teams from both ends of the ability range with half the competition challenging us every quarter, resulting in some cracking games to play and watch and then the other half, were teams with many new players to footy and were still in a developmental phase. At the beginning these games challenged our boys as they needed to understand why the coaches kept moving the magnets around at half time. We explained this was to ensure games were not blown out and how we needed to rely more on our own developing players which was not only important to our team development but equally important to the competition too. The maturity of the boys shone in these moments and embraced the different game plans.

One of the greatest strengths the boys carried forward from last year to this year was not only their on-field fine decision making but how they worked on positioning themselves across the field, due to this we saw many times the ability to switch the play to the outside, use the open spaces and have the ball move down field without any or little pressure on the ball carriers. This resulted in boys having many set shots from right in front of goals. Each week we look to bring the whole team into the game where we pass to the open player regardless of who it was and we played real team footy all the while continuing to improve. Our team goal is always 'leave no boy behind'.

We continue to have a high level of positive encouragement within the group with many of the boys taking on a captains-type role on game day and we love how they bring all 17 boys along the same journey and how important it is to keep improving the team from the bottom up. We continued using the same game day rotation system as it was so effective for the last three years, which had a threefold benefit. Firstly, each line of 3 moved up the field each quarter ensuring no one was left in a part of the field for more than a quarter where the ball possibly wasn't. Secondly, playing with the same 3 boys over the whole game improved their knowledge on how each of them plays, and lastly everyone had an opportunity to build on their understanding of each position across the field. This movement also kept them interested in the upcoming challenges, fresh for each quarter and ready to take on a new opponent. Their appreciation of all positions continues to increase and their desire to shine whether at full back, midfield or on a flank was noticeable at each quarter time break.

The high sportsmanship we showed on and off field is definitely a highlight of our season. We pride ourselves on playing hard but fair and as a team we were gracious when we played well, and we held our heads up high when we didn't. We rarely judged or criticised, we always sang the song loud and proud and gave praise to every certificate recipient every game. We introduced some life skills this year too, one example was for every boy to have good eye contact when they greeted the coaches at both training and on game day and with a firm handshake. Great qualities from a special group of fine young men.
